

- Check your Schoology everyday. Deadlines are set for 11:59pm.
- Online assignments **NEED** to be completed before meeting in person again.
- Assignments will be posted in Schoology but you will need to use other apps or programs to complete them. This is a project-based class and some things can only be accomplished in class. Choose your time wisely.
- I give plenty of lab time. If you don't finish your work in class, it's your responsibility to find time to finish.
- If you don't like an assignment score, you are welcome to a redo, but communicate with me first to understand why you received that grade and what you're going to do different to earn a better grade.
- Work hard to get everything in on time. It will quickly start to accumulate and you'll give up before you even start. If anything is submitted late, you need to communicate with me through Schoology. Don't make your timeline my timeline. It won't be graded immediately so don't ask.
- Go back over material in Schoology before asking for help. This is where your notes come in handy as well. You're responsible young adults and you need to be able to independently problem solve. Google is also a good resource. I'm always here to help but I'm not here to do your work.
- Communicate excused absences and missing work with me ahead of time if possible.
- It's 100% ok to fail. It's not ok to NOT try or put in effort just to get it done. Think outside the box –everyone can be creative. Photography is an art and a science.

PHOTOS OUTSIDE OF CLASSROOM

- It is a privilege to leave the classroom to take photos. Do NOT abuse it or I will take it away. This is a CTE class so professionalism is expected at all times; watch your language and how you address others. Be considerate and appropriate.
 WFHS staff will notify me if they hear or see issues from poor behavior. Be respectful, but you already know that.
- Don't be disruptive to other classes. Walk in the hallways and talk quietly.
- Wear your hallway passes around your neck so staff can easily identify you're in my class. I also try and make staff aware who my students are so you have the opportunity to move around.
- Your phones stay in the classroom. Do not bring them with.
- If you're not understanding the photo assignment, come talk to me and ask for help and clarification. Don't take photos just to get it done. Show me your photos!
- Locker rooms and bathrooms are off-limits.
- Ask permission before taking someone's photo. (Hello, my name is...I am with the yearbook, may I take your photo?)
- If weather is nice, we will go outside as a class and professional behavior is expected just like all other times.
