

Information from our School Nurse

Welcome Back to School! I hope everyone had a safe and health summer and are ready for a fun filled year of learning! Cold and Flu season will be here before we know it and we want to make sure we continue to keep ourselves and each other healthy! Here are a few reminders of recommended public health measures that can be used to prevent the spread of illnesses at school and in our community:

- Keep anyone sick at home. Follow the "When to Keep Your Child At Home" guidelines for returning to school after illness. Find more information on the FSD website.
- Frequent Handwashing with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds. Use hand sanitizer when handwashing is not available.
- Remember respiratory etiquette and cover your coughs and sneezes. Sneeze or cough into your elbow instead of directly into your hands.
- · Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces often.
- Stay up to date with recommended vaccines such as the influenza vaccine.
