What are AP Courses?

AP Courses are classes that <u>cover college-</u> <u>level content</u> and use advanced-level skills <u>but are designed for high school students</u>

AP courses require:

- <u>critical reading</u> & <u>thinking</u>, <u>analysis and</u>
 <u>synthesis</u>, <u>problem-solving</u>, and <u>writing</u>
 <u>each DAY on behalf of the student</u>
- dedication, organization, timeinvestment, and commitment for the duration



What are AP Courses?

Different AP **Courses are offered** at WHS based on:

- student interest/requested enrollment
- qualified staff availability

All AP Courses are weighted on a 6.0 GPA scale** (for more information, see p. 36-37 of the <u>24-25 Student Handbook</u>)

** Class of 2026, 2027, 2028 only; Class of 2025, AP Core Content and LOTE only



AP Courses & College Credit:

 they are courses designed for high school students, and

AP Courses & College Credit

 credit may be earned with a qualifying AP exam score (multiple choice, FRQ, LEQ, and/or performance tasks) if they are shared with a college or university

AP Exams are corresponding end-of-course exams for Advanced Placement courses, not unlike a STAAR EOC.

Who can take an AP Exam?


Anyone can take any AP Exam they choose to register for, even ones we do not offer as a course: This often happens when we have:

• DC course students with a parallel AP Course

• Students are <u>taking a course elsewhere</u> (i.e. homeschool or virtual school students)

• When <u>students have prior advanced knowledge</u> or are native speakers

• When they choose to <u>self-study</u>.



AP Exams are standardized exams designed to

see how well a student has mastered the

content & skills of a specific AP course.

If a student <u>earns a qualifying score</u> (a 3, 4, or

5), they <u>may earn college credit</u> depending on

their choice of college's or degree program's

a fee of \$40 per exam if:


- students order after a deadline

Students and families are responsible for any late fees IN ADDITION TO regular exam fees.





How to Register for AP Exams in 2 STEPS

1. Student must connect to their teacher's AP Classroom

portal using the specific join code (see last slide)

[myap.collegeboard.org] AND

2. Students must complete registration on the WHS Total

Registration portal [www.TotalRegistration.net/AP/447565]

- If students have not received an email confirmation receipt from total registration and paid their minimum down payment by the deadline, they have not completed registration
- If they've not completed both steps, I cannot physically order them an exam

Submitted

Q: How do students earn college credit for an AP Exam? Students who have earned a 3, 4, or 5 must submit their qualifying score to the college or university they are applying or enrolling at by logging in to their collegeboard.org account, choosing "My AP" and requesting a score send.

Q: Can students in a DC (dual credit) course take an AP Exam? Anyone can take any AP Exam of their choice including ones not currently offered at WHS (DC students, virtual/homeschool students, or students self-studying a course of their choice). All they need to do is complete both steps to register.

Q: How does my student know if they've registered for their AP exam(s) or completed both steps to register? Students should first log in to their <u>myap.collegeboard.org</u> account and look to see if they have course badges with AP exam dates/times listed on their dashboard for each AP course they are taking. Second, students should have an AP Exam registration confirmation email from Total Registration. If they are missing either, have them see Mrs. Rogers in the library.
