Highlighting percentage point growth

- Anderson increased 9 percentage points across all grade levels
 - Highlighted by a 13 percentage point increase in 3rd grade and a 10 percentage point increase in 5th grade
- Mitchell increased 9 percentage points across all grade levels
 - Highlighted by an 7 percentage point increase in 4th grade
- Smith increased 10 percentage points across all grade levels
 - Highlighted by a 22 percentage point increase in 4th grade and a 10 percentage point increase in 5th grade

Highlighting percentage point growth

- Anderson increased 8 percentage points across all grade levels
 - Highlighted by an 9 percentage point increase in 4th grade and a 12 percentage point increase in 5th grade
- Smith increased 13 percentage points across all grade levels
 - Highlighted by a 10 percentage point increase in 3rd grade, a 12 percentage point increase in 4th grade, and an 18 percentage point increase in 5th grade

Focus on supporting student learning as well as student engagement

Data was celebrated and posted

Every teacher held data chats with students that included goal setting

Anderson

In collaboration with staff, established at the beginning of the school year, a clear "Data informed student focus"

Attendance was a focus and held weekly team meets and was discussed regularly at staff meeting

Two 1:1 Data Discussions between admin and teacher to review results, individual student needs, small groups, and interventions

Mitchell

Providing, during math, contextual vocabulary focus for all students but specifically our EL students

Implementing iReady MyPath and beyond ex. for early finishers

Frequent collaboration between site admin to check in on what was working and what wasn't with specific students

Summative SBAC Students with Disabilities Highlights: Percentage Point Growth

FDR increased by 20.8 percentage points for SWD across all grade levels in ELA and **increased** by 9.5 percentage points in Math

Mitchell increased by 8.1 percentage points for SWD across all grade levels in ELA

Twain increased by 12.5 percentage points for SWD across all grade levels in ELA and **increased** by 9.75 percentage points in Math

Rogers increased by 5.1 percentage points for SWD across all grade levels in ELA

Smith 5th grade SWD **increased** by 8.0 percentage points in ELA and **highlighted** by 50% of 5th grade SWD showing an overall increase in scores in both ELA and Math moving up into Nearly Met, Met or Exceeded



Bright Spots:

- 5th graders at Anderson grew by an average of 45 scale score points; 2nd graders grew by an average of 49.
- Half of **Addams' 8th graders** grew by **51** scale score points or more.
