Edina High School Achieves Academic Milestones

AP Results Soar: 91% Pass Rate

he Advanced Placement (AP) exam results were compiled this summer and reveal the strongest data in the past five years, with 91 percent of students earning a passing grade of 3 or higher. According to the AP College Board "Research shows that students who receive a score of 3 or higher on AP Exams typically experience greater academic success in college and have higher graduation rates than their non-AP peers."

An impressive number of students earned special recognition. Of the 1,146 students who took 2,388 exams, 527 were named AP Scholars, with 93 earning the AP Scholar with Honor title and 252 receiving the prestigious AP Scholar with Distinction recognition. Additionally, two students achieved the highly coveted AP International Diploma, demonstrating exceptional performance across multiple subject areas. These achievements give students a stronger start to their higher education journey, earning valuable college credits and financial savings.
