#### **Registration of Credentials or Other Certification Documents**

The Santa Barbara County Education Office (SBCEO) registers credentials provided to all individuals throughout Santa Barbara County who have been issued credentials and permits by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC). (Education Code § 44332.5)

The content in this section of the report is informational.

#### **Issuance of Temporary County Certificates**

Temporary County Certificates (TCC) are issued by SBCEO to individuals during the interim period from when they apply for a credential with the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing to when they are issued or denied the official credential.

A TCC allows an individual to actively work and be paid for service in those positions for which the credential is required while they await final clearance of their credential or permit.

Temporary County Certificates must be approved by the County Board of Education. (Education Code § 44332)

#### **Santa Barbara County Board of Education**

Personnel reports pertaining to SBCEO personnel, employed by the Santa Barbara County Superintendent of Schools

The certificated and classified personnel reports are provided to the board as an information item.

#### **Certificated Personnel Report**

Certificated employees are those whose positions require a specific credential issued by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing.

The certificated personnel report is generated regularly and includes all actions made regarding employment of certificated employees at SBCEO such as appointments and separations.

#### **Classified Personnel Report**

Classified employees are those whose positions do not require a state-issued credential. Since 1975, the Santa Barbara County Education Office has operated a Merit System for the classified service. Merit System law (Education Code § 45240-45320) provides that classified employees are selected, retained and promoted on the basis of merit and fitness, exclusive of discrimination due to actual or perceived race, color, ethnicity, age, religion, political affiliation, marital status, disability, gender, sexual orientation or national origin. The Personnel Commission, composed of three members, is the impartial body authorized by the state to be responsible for implementing and interpreting Merit System rules and adjudicating appeals on those facets of employment within its purview.

The classified personnel report is typically generated monthly and includes all personnel actions affecting classified employees at SBCEO such as appointments, changes to status, and separations.

#### **SBCEO DIVISIONS**

#### **Administrative Services Division**

**New Director of Facilities:** We are pleased to announce the selection of Marc Cunningham as SBCEO's new director of facilities. Marc previously served as the construction project manager for Simi Valley Unified School District where he oversaw construction projects including large building construction, infrastructure, and site improvement projects throughout the district. Marc has also worked for a Santa Barbara-based construction company where he oversaw the building of several public and private schools throughout Southern California.

Marc brings to SBCEO a depth of knowledge and experience in the areas of construction, project management, and public contract code and policy. In addition, he is known for his collaborative leadership style and fostering positive and productive partnerships with his peers and associates. Marc began his new role on August 19.

**Year-End Close:** Fiscal Services staff are working on the 2023-24 year-end close in preparation for completion of the Unaudited Actuals to be submitted in October.

**District Fiscal Support:** School Business Advisory Services (SBAS) district financial advisors are supporting districts in the completion of their unaudited actuals and their year-end-close procedures. District and charter school unaudited actuals are due to SBCEO by September 15.

**District Budget Approval:** SBAS district financial advisors are in the process of reviewing district adopted budgets for compliance with state criteria and standards and to determine if the budgets allow the districts to meet their financial obligations. On or before September 15, SBCEO shall approve, conditionally approve, or disapprove the adopted budget for each school district.

#### <u>Curriculum and Instruction Division</u>

**Universal Pre-K:** The California Department of Education released the Preschool/ Transitional Kindergarten Learning Foundations (PTKLF) this summer, and we introduced them to the Curriculum Council on August 30. The California PTKLF outlines key knowledge and skills that most children ages three to five and a half years old can achieve when provided with the kinds of interactions, instruction, and environments that research has shown to promote early learning and development, whether it be in center-based, home-based, or TK settings. Training and workshops on the 9 domains are scheduled throughout the fall for teachers and leaders, beginning September 18.

**LCAP Approvals:** The LCAP review and approval process is in its final phase. This year, the LCAP required substantially more work than in years past due to new requirements and the expansion of the scope of reporting. About half of the districts received clarification requests by August 15 and worked diligently to meet each technical requirement. Our team worked with each district individually to ensure every LCAP meets the approval criteria by the September 15 deadline for budget approval.

**Differentiated Assistance:** We have added a new dimension of Tier 1 (Universal) support for districts and charters this year. Beginning this fall, any local educational agency (LEA) who fails to certify their California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System (CALPADS) data at any point in the year will require technical assistance. On September 6, we will host the first of a 3-part proactive CALPADS training for leaders, which aligns with and prepares for each of the submission deadlines. We continue to provide differentiated technical assistance to the districts who qualified for Tier 2 support on the December 2023 Dashboard. District support lasts for two years as they implement their improvement initiatives.

**Ethnic Studies:** The Ethnic Studies Community of Practice will meet for the first of three convenings on September 19. Dr. José Navárro, of Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, will be the guest speaker, and the meeting will feature a student project spotlight, resource and strategy sharing, and discussions of implementation progress. All districts with high schools are participating in the network. High schools must offer ethnic studies beginning with the 2025-26 school year.

**Math, Science, Computer Science:** SBCEO is the state-wide lead for mathematics. The first state convening for 400 mathematics educators will take place in Sacramento, October 1-2, hosted by SBCEO. Our local Communities of Practice for math, science and computer science will meet in the north county on October 9, and in the south county on October 23. A leadership series for administrators begins on October 25.

**Teacher Induction Program (TIP):** TIP is finalizing enrollment for year one and year two teachers and their mentors. Mentor training is differentiated by mentor experience level. Kickoff for the first cycle of inquiry – the Individual Learning Plan – begins the final week of September.

Preliminary Administrative Services Credential (PASC) and Clear Administrative Services Credential (CASC) Programs: Our administrative services credential programs also kicked off the new school year. PASC cohort 17 began in August with a diverse group of emerging leaders pursuing their preliminary services credential. The classes meet on weekends over a year, with candidates completing coursework, fieldwork, an action research project, and a three-part performance assessment. CASC, the Clear Administrative Services Credential program, began last week with both year one and year two candidates and their coaches. The job-embedded administrator induction program provides new administrators with a coach for mentoring and support as they engage in cycles of inquiry and reflection.

**Inclusion Network:** We will begin year two of our Inclusion Network with a "bootcamp" for new district teams on September 16. We will continue to work with Supporting Inclusive Practices (SIP) from the statewide system of support and have added additional partners this year. Teams receive coaching, resource matching, and feedback between the quarterly meetings, based on their plans.

**Social and Emotional Learning (SEL):** Several of our districts are taking advantage of the SEL resources we are providing for the final year of the Social and Emotional Learning grant. We are supporting a SEL collaborative in Santa Ynez Valley and providing restorative practices and circles, training and coaching, in our Juvenile Court and Community Schools (JCCS) and some of the county's continuation high schools. We have engaged with several renowned providers for assemblies, songwriting, goal setting, and workshops for students and staff, so that schools and districts can integrate these supports directly into their offerings for no cost, and without the administrative burden.

#### **Human Resources Division**

**Open Enrollment:** In August, we conducted our benefits open enrollment period, including bringing vendors on site for two benefits fairs so employees could learn more about their health and welfare plans and retirement system. An estimated 60 employees attended the Santa Barbara benefits fair and 45 attended the Santa Maria fair. The new user-friendly benefits portal successfully resulted in 455 people updating their benefits choices.

**COVID-19 Test Kits:** In February 2024, the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) stopped providing free at-home COVID-19 test kits to schools and county offices of education (COEs). While SBCEO still has a small supply available, with the summertime COVID-19 surge, SBCEO needed to find an alternate source of no-cost at-home test kits. After reaching out to state and federal sources, Human Resources advocated for our staff and students to our local public health department and was able to obtain a pallet of more than 5,500 tests that will be delivered in the next couple of weeks. Subsequently, CDPH has established an ongoing supply for COEs through a federal Health and Human Services portal called HPOP.

#### **Special Education Division**

On Friday, August 2, Vandenberg Space Force Base hosted their annual Salute to Students event for the families of military personnel. Lompoc nonprofits and local agencies showcased their services that support youth and children. SBCEO Special Education division leadership attended the event to share information on special education programming and employment opportunities within the SBCEO Special Education division.

#### **Student and Community Services Division**

School Safety: The 2024 Santa Barbara County School Safety Symposium Registration is Now Open: The Santa Barbara County Education Office is hosting a one-day, in-person School Safety Symposium focused on release and reunification training. This event will be led by nationally recognized school safety expert Jeffrey Solomon of Consortium Training and Consulting. The symposium is designed for district and school leaders, early care and education partners, higher education safety leads, first responders, and school resource officers. Attendees will receive instructional information and participate in a hands-on reunification exercise. The goal of the workshop is to equip participants with the knowledge and training necessary to implement effective release and reunification procedures at their respective sites.

Behavioral Health and Wellness: Virtual Workshop: School-Linked Partnership Capacity Grant: Student and Community Services will be hosting a virtual workshop on September 10, 2024, from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. for districts and charter schools participating in the School-Linked Partnership and Capacity Grant Program. This program offers one-time funding to support schools in building behavioral health infrastructure. Nineteen districts and charter schools from across the county will be participating. Funding for this program will be available through June 2026.

School Climate and Student Engagement: Tobacco Use Prevention and Education (TUPE) Updates and California Healthy Kids Survey (CHKS) Training: In partnership with Fighting Back Santa Maria Valley, SBCEO will be hosting a meeting on Tuesday, September 17, 2024, from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. at the Buellton Recreation Center. The meeting will provide updates on Tobacco Use Prevention Education (TUPE) services available for students in grades 6-12, schools, and families. We will also discuss the California Healthy Kids Survey (CHKS), including a review of countywide data, the timeline for administering the survey, and the process for designing custom questions for this year's survey. All districts were asked to send their

TUPE coordinators, and community-based organizations are invited to participate in the development of the custom questions.

#### **Juvenile Court and Community Schools (JCCS)**

JCCS Students Showcase Musical Creativity in Collaborative Workshop: In collaboration with the Children's Creative Project, students in JCCS participated in an art workshop with a singer/songwriter during the week of May 20<sup>th</sup>. During the workshop, students learned how to arrange a song, identify beats, and sound effects to enhance rhythm, incorporate lyrics, and use a microphone as if they were in a professional music studio. With the support of their peers, they also tapped into their creativity to construct and refine their songs.

#### Transitional Youth Services (TYS)

**New and Improved TYS Webpage:** TYS is proud to present its enhanced webpage, designed to improve user experience and functionality. Key new features include:

- Resources for McKinney-Vento and Foster Care: Organized by audience (families, district liaisons, students) for easier access.
- Training Requests: A Google Form for requesting specific training sessions facilitated by TYS.
- Staff Information: Contact details and a brochure outlining the roles of the TYS department staff.
- Mission, Vision, and Values: Developed in collaboration with Meaning Makers Collective during the 2023-2024 school year.

TYS Engages the Community: New Training Programs to Empower and Educate: To better utilize the support provided by TYS, we have recognized the need to increase awareness among our community partners about TYS's capabilities. TYS has developed new training programs designed to introduce the department and the services it offers. These trainings include:

- Educational Rights of Foster Youth: As of August 20, 2024, TYS representatives are now part of the "Our County. Our Kids." program led by the Santa Barbara County Department of Social Services. TYS will provide training three times a month on the educational rights of foster youth, an essential component of the Resource Family Approval process for new Resource Parents in Santa Barbara County
- New Social Worker Training: Beginning on September 3, 2024, TYS introduced a bi-monthly educational segment in the Santa Barbara County Department of Social Services' (DSS) training for new social workers. Led by TYS Director Amy

- Willis, this presentation highlights the collaboration between DSS and TYS and helps establish relationships with social workers as they start their careers.
- Collaboration with Carpinteria Children's Project: On August 13, 2024, TYS
  Director Amy Willis and Health Advocate Gerardo Ayala spoke at the Carpinteria
  Children's Project's staff call back day to strengthen connections with them and
  to enhance collaboration and support for students transitioning from preschool to
  the public schools served by TYS.

These initiatives are part of our ongoing efforts to empower and educate our community partners about the vital support TYS provides.

Creativity and Community Unite: Collaboration Between UCSB and Agape/
Changing Faces Short-Term Residential Therapeutic Placement (STRTP): During a recent monthly check-in between TYS Director Amy Willis and Amanda Stilwell, director of Agape/Changing Faces STRTP, Amanda mentioned that all 13 of her foster youth residents have a strong interest in art. To support this passion, TYS Director Amy Willis connected Amanda with Stefany Rubio, director of the UCSB Guardian Scholars Program, who has both a background in art and a dedication to helping foster youth pursue higher education.

Following their introduction, the three of them brainstormed ideas, which led to an exciting in-person art project and a college introduction event for the foster youth residents, scheduled for September 9, 2024. If the residents enjoy this initiative, Stefany has agreed to make regular visits to continue inspiring them through art. They are also planning a trip for the residents to attend a UCSB basketball game on campus, further strengthening their connection to the university.
