

KS4 Curriculum Overview: Philosophy and Ethics 2024/25

Rationale: In Year 10 and 11 we aim to expand on the knowledge gained in KS3 and develop this through considering a range of world themes from both religious and non-religious perspectives. Students will cover a range of topics relating to the modern world and consider how different world views are shaped on these topics, as well as think about their own views and how these may have been shaped.
