California Community College System



- Community College registration opens during <u>Spring 2025</u> for incoming freshman.
- DVC will be hosting workshops to help you enroll.
- Registration info will be posted in the College & Career Google
 Classroom as soon as it becomes available in 2025.
- No SAT or ACT is required for acceptance.

University of California (UC)



10 UC Campuses throughout California

Requirements:

- Minimum 3.0 gpa (10th & 11th grade only)
- No subject tests (SAT, ACT) are required
- UC application (same application for all campuses)
- 4 Personal Insight Questions (pick 4 out of 8)
- \$80 fee per campus
- *UC San Francisco is only a graduate program
- NO letters of recommendation required

<u> Application filing period: October 1 - November 30</u>

California State University (CSU)

23 CSU Campuses throughout California

Requirements:

- Minimum 2.5 gpa (10th-11th grade only)
- Application (same application for all campuses)
- \$70 fee per campus
- NO letters of recommendation
- NO essay

<u> Application filing period: October 1 - November 30</u>



UC & CSU Eligibility

- Must have or will complete classes with a C or better for the A-G
 Courses
- Must "fix" any D's in A-G courses through APEX
- Classes with a "p" noted on the transcript are considered College Prep
- CR/NC (credit/no credit) not factored into the GPA
- CR is considered a passing grade
- No SAT/ACT required for admissions



Private Colleges & Universities

GPA and course requirements vary greatly, check each college website!

All schools require:

- Common application (apply to multiple schools at same time) or college specific application
- Send official test scores**
- Pay application fee
- Personal statement or essay
- Letters of recommendation (0-3 max)





Historically Black Colleges & Universities (HBCU's)

Historically Black colleges and universities are institutions of higher education founded to educate Black students. In the 19th century, when many colleges and universities refused to admit Black applicants, HBCU's offered those students a route to higher education. Anyone can apply to

NCAA/Student Athletes



Students who initially enroll full time during the 2024-25 academic years and intend to play NCAA Division I or II athletics will not be required to take a standardized test to meet NCAA initial-eligibility requirements.

Application Process

Decide Where to Apply: Common Data Set (CDS)

What is the Common Data Set?

A document with statistics and valuable information that tells you exactly what a college values in their admissions process. It can help to answer common questions such as:

- Relative importance of factors in admissions process (i.e., class rank, rigor, recommendations, essay, test scores, etc)
 - What is the average SAT/ACT score of admitted students?
 - What's the acceptance rate for first-time, degree-seeking applicants?

Letters of Recommendations

From Teachers:

- Request the letter in the Common App
- Complete brag sheet
- Let your teacher know in person, or via email, that you are requesting a letter of recommendation (at least 3 weeks ahead of time)
- Please do not ask for more than is needed.

From your Counselor/College & Career Advisor

- Request in person, via email Ask early, (3 weeks is ideal) - Add your Counselor to your Common App and request a letter if needed.
- Complete the bragsheet and send it to the Counselor.
- Be available for follow-up questions.
- Last minute requests cannot be accommodated.
- Please do not ask for more than is needed

Paying for College & Financial Aid

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)/California Dream Act (CADAA)

- Information in the FAFSA application determines eligibility for state aid, such as grants, scholarships and loans, or tuition waiver and eligibility for direct aid from the college you are planning to attend.
- 2. Certain scholarships, merit-aid or programs such as DVC's 4 CD promise program require FAFSA completion
- 3. FAFSA application to open in December 2024
- 4. Mandatory for all students to complete (4-year college, community college, Adult Education, trade or vocational school)
- 5. Application is launched from California Colleges.edu
