

The trip will conclude with a guided tour of Ringwood Manor, a National Historic Landmark District, having historical importance spanning from Native

Dawn of the Dinosaurs' Discovery

The first dinosaur was officially named 200 years ago in 1824, and since that time they have been a world-wide phenomenon. He has been referred to as "The Last Man Who Knew Everything," but few people today know of him and his great contributions to society. Dr. Leidy, played by Marc Rogoff, will talk about his discoveries, the people he worked with, demonstrate many of the tools he used, and relate how the public reacted to the 19th century's scientific breakthroughs.


