BOARDING Accommodation

In Jocelyn House, we believe in being caring, supportive and empowering. This is a space for you to grow and make friends with young women from around the world.

Boarders

Boarders live on the ground and first floor of the building. Fourth Form to Lower Sixth boarders have shared rooms, while Upper Sixth boarders have single rooms. Each room has a desk, bed, lockable storage and space for clothes and luggage. If you don't manage to fit all of your luggage in your room, we have a loft where we can safely store it.

Kitchens

There is a kitchen to cook delicious meals and make drinks with your friends. Please keep the kitchen tidy and make sure the equipment is returned to it's original home after use. We will always have basic food items such as bread, cereal and milk stocked in the kitchen in case you get hungry between school meals.

Common Room

Our Common Room is a fantastic space for relaxation. Here, you can unwind after the school day and socialise. We also use the Common Room as a meeting point.

Registration

Registration is necessary by legal regulations in all British Schools and helps us create a safe environment. We have two registration times each day, at 08:30 and 14:00 in tutor groups. At Culford, we place a high value on punctuality, and lateness is not considered acceptable. If you are late, we kindly ask that you notify us in advance through email or by calling the Duty Office. Upon arrival, pupils must sign in at Reception.

Activities and Free Time

You can choose different extra-curricular activities each term to develop your skills. Fourth Form and Lower Fifth sign up for an activity every day, while Upper Fifth have one afternoon off each week. CulfordVI sign up for two activities a week. On a Friday, we have House Activities and House Assemblies.

Alcohol

Alcohol is allowed only for CulfordVI on special occasions, supervised by staff. At all other times alcohol is not permitted on the school site including the Boarding House. It will be taken very seriously if you are found to have alcohol in your possession or to be associated with it.



Ashby is the dining room where you will have all your meals. There is a vast selection of delicious foods from around the world on offer.





Borrowing

Please do not borrow or lend clothing, money or other possessions.

Bullying

The Houses are a community where you should feel safe and happy. Bullying will not be tolerated and will be treated very seriously by the House staff.





Cars

If you pass your driving test during CulfordVI you can get a permit to have your car at school. Please see Mr Rackowe, Head of Sixth Form, who can explain how to register your car at school.

Clothing

Laundry is sent off Monday to Friday and returns usually within a couple of days. Your clean laundry goes on your shelf in the Matron's Room.

Please change your bedding every week, Matron will let you know when to do this. All garments must be suitable for machine-washing and tumble-drying. All your clothing and bedding needs to be clearly marked with your name. If you have any more questions on this, just ask your Matron.

Cleaning

Your rooms are cleaned Monday to Friday. Please keep your room and bathroom tidy so that they can be hoovered and cleaned. There are rewards for tidy rooms!

Commendations and Sanctions

Benefecits are awarded to pupils who show a good attitude to learning and excellent class work or prep. In the House, you can receive a benefecit for helping Matron, having a really tidy room, or helping others.

A non-satis may be issued if there is dissatisfaction with work, behaviour, dress, attendance or punctuality. A non-satis could also be issued in the Boarding House for a number of reasons, including an untidy room, being late to Roll call, not attending meals or rudeness to House staff.

Everything is recorded on the school system and your Housemistress, tutor, Head of Department, Deputy Head and the School Office will be aware of these.









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Going Out

Signing in and out is very important - if there is ever an emergency we will need to know where you are. We have a signing out system that we will explain to you in person. You can also sign in and out using the tablet in Reception.

Boarders can go off-site with friends or family if they have the written permission of their parents and Housemistress. Please organise this at least four days in advance.



Google Classroom

There will be a House Google Classroom and a boarders Google Classroom for you to join. Important and useful information will be posted there, so please utilise this!

House Security

The House is locked every night. You will be made aware of the code when necessary and it is important this is not shared. Please remember to turn off the lights and close windows in your studies when you are leaving. Please ensure expensive items are safely stored away.

Health Centre

If you feel unwell during the day, you should go to the Health Centre where our fantastic team will take care of you. It is open 08:00-18:00 Monday - Friday, and 08:30-12:30 on Saturday. If you feel unwell after school, on the weekend or at night, there are staff members living in the House who can help you. Any medicine you bring from home should be shown to your Matron as soon as you arrive.

Kitchen

In the evenings you can make toast and get a warm drink, or use the microwave in the kitchen. You are welcome to cook food at weekends with the permission of House staff.

The Library

The library is open:

Monday - Thursday until 21:00

Friday until 17:00

Saturday until 12:15

In the evening, please let the member of staff on duty know if you are going to the library.



The Loft

This is on the top floor, for storing your suitcases. Please try not to bring lots of new items to school after the holidays as the storage is limited. Everything in the loft should be in a closed bag, box or suitcase and clearly named.



Lost Property

Please look for any lost items in the lost property areas, there is one in the House kept by Matron. There is also another lost property area in the Sports Centre and one in Main School.

Money and Passports

Please do not bring large amounts of money to school. If you do keep money in your room, please put it in your lockable cupboard. Passports should be given to House staff to keep safe.



Paddy & Scott's

The CulfordVI café is open during the week at lunchtime and on a Friday night for pupils to visit with their friends.

Performance Sport

Lots of pupils do extra sports sessions outside of lesson time. Please speak to House staff if you need extra support with food, organisation or anything else.



Prefects are a group of Upper Sixth pupils who organise activities and help out within the house. They are chosen by their Housemistress because they are helpful, caring and trustworthy people who want everyone to feel as comfortable and happy in their house and at Culford as they can.

Prep (Homework)

After the evening roll call you will have time to do your prep in your room. Pupils in Upper Fifth or above can go to the library.





Security

Your bedroom has built in cupboards and lockable storage to keep your belongings safe. Each bedroom has a Salto key which you are responsible for. There is a fee for lost keys, so please take good care of them.





Smoking and Vaping

Culford is a non-smoking site. Pupils, staff and visitors are not allowed to smoke or vape on site. If you have cigarettes or a vape in your possession and you are discovered smoking on the premises, please expect a punishment.

Snacks

Fruit and biscuits are provided in the House during the day. If you would like to bring your own snacks, please keep them in a food container in your room.

Sports Centre

You are welcome to use the sports centre after school, including the swimming pool and gym. For more details, please talk to the House staff or visit the sports centre to discuss.


Social Events

This is the programme you will use to look at your timetable, view activity lists and check the details of sports fixtures and teams.





Takeaways

If House staff give permission, you are allowed to order a takeaway on Saturday nights. Takeaways should not be ordered at any other time.

Taxis

Taxis can only be booked by house staff and all trips off-site must be authorised by them with a minimum of 48 hours notice.

Tutor

Your tutor will be available during morning and afternoon registration to help you with any problems you may have. You will also have regular meetings with them to talk about your progress, which is a really beneficial time to ask any questions or raise queries.

Uniform

All pupils must look smart, be appropriately dressed at all times and wear the correct school uniform during the day. Please talk to your Matron if you have any problems with your uniform.

Visitors - Pupils

You are allowed to visit all boarding houses, and day pupils are also allowed to visit you. Only those of the same gender are allowed in bedroom areas, and it should be by invitation.

Visitors - Adults

All visitors must report to the person on duty in the House, where they will be escorted to their destination. This includes friends and relatives of boarders.





Washing Machine

The washing machine is available for CulfordVI boarders to use. All other boarders should speak to Matron if they need to use it.

Wifi

You will be able to access the wifi after your IT induction. Your tutor will be able to tell you more about this. If you need to use the House phone, just ask the House staff.

Uniform List

- School blazer

- A simple chain with a discreet pendant suitable for a traditional office environment worn around the neck
- A single pair of earrings suitable for a traditional office environment worn by girls, one in each ear through the lowest part of the earlobe
- No rings or bracelets may be worn by pupils in Fourth Form and Fifth Form.
- No nail polish is allowed to be worn by pupils in Fourth Form and Fifth Form.



Coats


• Only Culford branded coats are permitted please. These can be purchased from the same site as your school uniform: My School Blazer.

Hair

• All pupils should have tidy, neatly brushed hair, which should be a natural colour.

Headgear

 No hats or headgear should be worn with school uniform, except by special permission from the Assistant Head Pastoral on religious grounds.



CulfordVI

To better prepare Sixth Form students for the modern workplace in the 23/24 academic year, we've updated clothing guidance. A full formal suit, in line with the main uniform, remains mandatory, reflecting Culford's professional environment. Occasionally, students can opt for separates to emulate a more informal work setting. This offers flexibility while upholding our school's values and culture.

Main Uniform

- All students are required to wear a full formal suit as per main uniform guidelines
- Shirts and blouses are mandatory, requiring collars
- Smart shoes are required; suede allowed, no thick-soled trainers or boots
- Jewellery should be kept to a minimum of one bracelet and one pair of earrings

Informal Attire (Occasional)

- Separate skirts or trousers allowed with jackets/blazers of different colour or plain design
- Sober colouring for skirts/trousers
- Chinos or smart trousers allowed, must be ankle length and professionally cut
- No denim or informal fabrics permitted
- Smart shoes are required; suede allowed, no thick-soled trainers or boots





Headgear

 No hats or headgear should be worn with school uniform, except by special permission from the Deputy Head
 Pastoral on religious grounds.

Jewellery

- One plain ring on the hand
- No necklaces (except a plain singlestranded necklace), bracelets, festival or friendship bangles are allowed
- No facial studs/rings are permitted
