

State Required Assessments

Purposes of Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments and ACCESS testing:

1. To measure achievement towards meeting the Minnesota Academic Standards (for the Standards-Based Accountability Assessments) and to measure progress towards meeting Minnesota's Standards for English Language Development (for English Language Proficiency Assessments).
2. To measure the academic progress of students over time.
3. To provide Minnesota graduates with information related to career and college readiness.

National Assessments

NAEP

The National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) is an integral measure of academic progress across the nation and over time. It is the largest nationally representative and continuing assessment of what our nation’s students know and can do in various subjects such as civics, mathematics, reading, and U.S. history. The program also provides valuable insights into students’ educational experiences and opportunities to learn in and outside of the classroom.

NAEP is a congressionally mandated program administered by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), within the U.S. Department of Education and the Institute of Education Sciences.

College Entrance Exams

PSAT/NMSQT stands for the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test which students at ROCORI can take in the fall of their junior year. High enough marks on the PSAT/NMSQT as a junior can help a student land a National Merit Scholarship. This test also provides effective practice/experience for preparing for the SAT.

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ACT is a college readiness assessment produced by ACT, Inc., which provides information to students, their parents, and educators regarding the level of preparedness for postsecondary success on a nationally recognized college entrance exam. The ACT consists of assessments in English, Mathematics, Reading, Science and Writing (Optional). Each of the subject areas are scored individually and the student is provided a Composite score. All scores are college reportable. The ACT also provides valuable information for career planning.
