### Loving Literacy- Mrs. Reffett, Literacy Coach

Do you want to help your child with spelling? Check out the finger stretching strategy below:

**Finger stretching** is an effective strategy for identifying, saying, and counting the sounds in a word. Start by placing your hand in a fist and, starting with your thumb, "stretch" 1 finger up for each sound. It is important to do this from left to right to match the direction that we read! See the picture above for an example word.




5th Grade students are learning about mean, median, and mode by flying paper rockets!

# Supporting Learning

Ideas for Helping Kids Grow

## Vocabulary Growth

One way to help your child grow is to encourage learning of new vocabulary. This can be done in everyday activities. Provide simple, kid-friendly definitions and then give examples of using the work related to their daily life.

Another option is to pick out specific words when reading with your child.

Then follow up later by using those new words in conversation!

## Cause and Effect

The cause explains why something happens. The effect is the description of what happened. Many simple activities can be done at home and in the backyard that will help develop your child's understanding of cause and effect. Consider these ideas: Play a simple game in which you orally provide a situation (or a cause). Ask your child to fill in an action (or an effect). For example, you could say, "It was snowing outside." Your child could fill in, "All the kids got their sleds." "Someone rang the doorbell," could be answered with "Our dog began to bark." This game is perfect for helping your child realize that there is not one single right answer – they will learn that there can be several causes and several effects.
