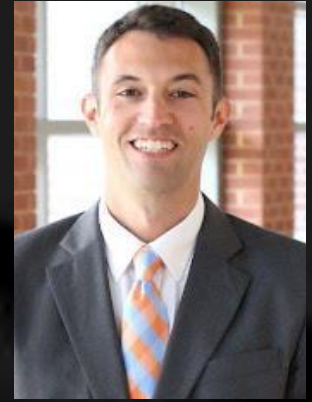

Attendance

- Teachers will take daily class attendance.
- Chronic absenteeism will be addressed by EHS grade level administrators.
- Daily class attendance and grade alert notifications will be sent to any phone number set up through the app. (Infinite Campus)

Attendance reminders

- Students leaving school while it is in session should have a pass from grade-level office and sign out (with ID) at the Welcome Center/Front Desk.
- Parents picking up students during school should go to the Welcome Center/Front Desk or call from car.
- Students arriving late to school should sign in (with ID) at the security desk by the Welcome Center/Front Desk.

Late to Class Policy

- ◆ 1st Tardy- verbal warning from teacher
- ◆ 2nd Tardy—Written/verbal warning from principal. Letter home to families
- ◆ 3rd Tardy—Principal Assigned After School Detention, phone call and letter home to parents
- ◆ 4th+ Tardy- Discipline at discretion of class principal

Expectations and Procedures

CELL PHONES:

- Unless otherwise directed by the classroom teacher, cell phones should be put away and out of sight at all times.



EARBUDS/HEADPHONES:



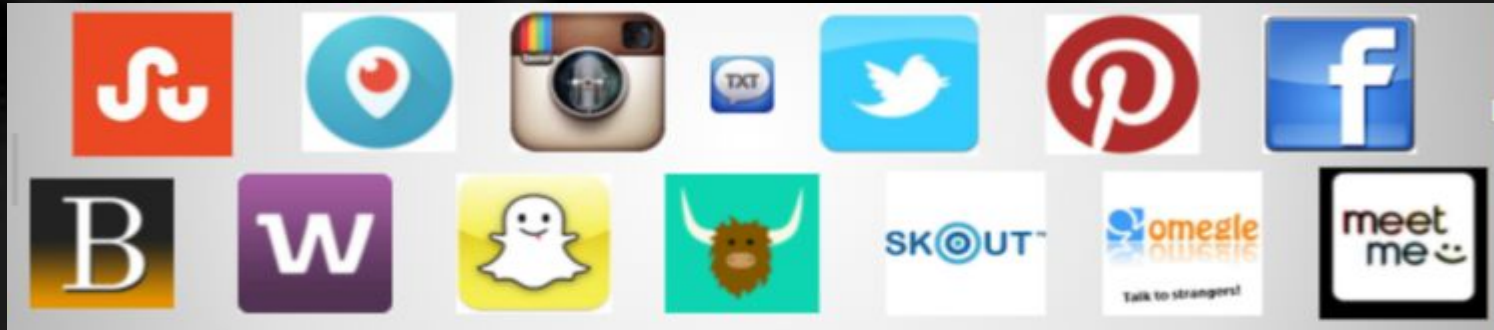
- No earbuds or headphones are allowed during class time.

THINK BEFORE YOU POST!

PHONE USAGE AT EHS

- ◆ There are appropriate times and places for phone usage

OK to use phone:

- ◆ before school and after school hours
- ◆ in hallways during passing periods
- ◆ lunch
- ◆ With prior approval of classroom teacher for learning purposes

NOT OK to use phone:

- ◆ instructional time
- ◆ in the hallway while in class
- ◆ locker room or bathroom space
- ◆ when someone is speaking to you in person

Sharing photos, videos and images that disrupt the learning environment will not be tolerated and can be subject to discipline.

RSD POLICY ON DRESS CODE

Students will dress in a manner that shows respect to all who work at or attend EHS.

Students may not wear any depictions of alcohol, drugs, tobacco, vaping, or firearms.

Clothing may not state imply, or depict hate speech/imagery targeting groups based on race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, religious affiliation, or any other protected classifications.

The EHS dress code applies to everyone regardless of gender.

RSD Harassment Policy

It is the policy of the district to maintain a learning environment that is free from harassment because of an individual's race, color, sex, national origin, ethnicity, disability, sexual orientation, or perceived sexual orientation.

The district prohibits any and all forms of unlawful harassment and discrimination because of race, color, sex, national origin, ethnicity, disability, sexual orientation, or perceived sexual orientation.

RSD Harassment Policy

Any student who believes he or she has been the victim of sexual harassment or harassment based on race, color, national origin, ethnicity, disability, sexual orientation, or perceived sexual orientation by a student, teacher, administrator, or other school personnel of the district, or by any other person who is participating in, observing, or otherwise engaged in activities, including sporting events and other extracurricular activities, under the auspices of the district, is encouraged to immediately report the alleged acts to their grade level principal.

BULLYING

- ◆ “Intimidation, unwarranted aggressive behavior, or harassment that is repetitive or is substantially likely to be repeated and causes a reasonable student to fear for his or her physical safety or property, substantially interferes with the educational performance, opportunities or benefits of any student without exception: or substantially disrupts the orderly operation of the school.
- ◆ Bullying may consist of physical actions, including gestures, or oral, cyberbullying, electronic, or written communication, and any threat of retaliation for reporting such acts.”

ACADEMIC DISHONESTY

- Academic Dishonesty: Includes, but is not limited to:
- Bringing answers into a testing area.
- Copying homework or assessments from another student.
- Providing answers for another student, using unauthorized notes or TECHNOLOGY (Ex: Chat GBT, Ai).
- Taking credit for work that one didn't do by failing to acknowledge author, parent, friend, or tutor assistance.
 - Incidents of Academic Dishonesty can be reported to colleges.

LUNCH

30 minutes to eat

Students will stay in the Commons or courtyard during lunch- smaller space than last year outside. No access to Gym A&B

There are bathrooms in Commons, so no need to leave or be in any other parts of the building

Pick up your trash- it's not our responsibility to pick up after you. This is our collective space and responsibility

Push your chairs in or help stack chairs if you eat second lunch

If you spill something, please let an adult know so we can help. You are responsible for crumbs, wrappers on your table, etc.

After School Policy-Buses

Discipline

Tobacco/e-Cigs/Vape/etc.

- ⊙ Possession, Use, Sale or Transfer of any tobacco products by students is prohibited. As is:
 - Smoke or vapor coming from your mouth or nose.
 - Smoke or vapor coming from area occupied by students.
 - Possession or use of electronic, “vapor/vape” or other delivery devices, substitute forms of cigarettes, or any other tobacco/cbd/thc innovation device.
 - May lead to a search of student items, car and/or locker.

These items are NOT allowed on campus at any time.

Violation Consequences:

- 1st offense: Minimum 3 Days ISS
- 2nd offense: Minimum 3 Days OSS
- 3rd offense: Minimum 5 Days OSS

Unattended Students

- ◆ Students should be in their assigned areas at all times.
- ◆ Students should not be wondering the halls, hanging out in restrooms or walking the campus unattended/without a pass from their CURRENT teacher, administrator or staff member.
- ◆ Students NEED to be where they are supposed to be; when they are supposed to be there! NO EXCEPTIONS.
- ◆ It is NOT your responsibility to “help” a friend find where they are going. You need to concentrate on YOUR academic success.

Academic Lab

Academic Lab: AcLab

- What is it? -Time for you to receive extra instruction, practice and time during the school day to learn and grow academically.
- When is it?- Begins with HOMEROOM check-in (7 minutes) AFTER 4th Period on “B” Days. This is followed by TWO 37 minute labs that you or your teacher will sign you up for.
- Why do we have this?- To ensure that YOU receive the instruction, practice and time that YOU need to meet your goals academically.
- How do we sign up?- YOU and your teachers will sign up using Infinite Campus.
- Is this just EHS?- NO. All RSD high schools have AcLab.

How it Works

You will only have the ability to sign up for upcoming LAB sessions one day prior.

You must sign up for both LAB sessions in advance and have those selections finished before Homeroom ends each B day.

A teacher's specific LAB session could fill up so you need to sign up asap.

A teacher may request you to come to their AcLab session which locks you out of selecting for that session.

You are welcome to stay with your Homeroom teacher if that best suits your needs, but you must sign up for that also.
