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New Transportation Platform

Student bus information will be available through the new My Ride K-12 platform. The My Ride K-12 platform will provide secure data for bus assignment, bus stop and schedule information for each OFCS student through a dedicated website portal and/or mobile app. The Transportation Department will also use the new My Ride K-12 app to provide custom notifications throughout the year regarding route delays and other updates regarding bus information. The My Ride K-12 app also provides parents and guardians with the ability to message the OFCS Transportation Department directly.

All families will need to set up an account either through the My Ride K-12 website or My Ride K-12 mobile app in order to access their student's bus information for the 2024-2025 school year. New Cell Phone Policy for All Students

Research shows that student use of cellphones in schools has negative effects on student performance and mental health. Cell phones distract students from classroom instruction, resulting in smaller learning gains. Increased cell phone use has led to higher levels of depression, anxiety, and other mental health disorders in children.

Maintaining the integrity of the learning environment is our top priority and the use of cell phones has deteriorated the quality of classroom instruction. We understand that the last few years have been tough and students have gravitated to cell phone usage as a strong means of socialization. We need to get back to the basics of in-class instruction and one way is the elimination of our top distraction — our CELL PHONE. By implementing this policy, we aim to create a learning environment that fosters focus, engagement, and academic success while helping students develop important life skills.

Our rationale for implementing a new cell phone policy is for the following reasons:

We understand that cell phones are an important part of your daily lives, and we want to reassure you that you will still have opportunities to use them. Cell phones may be used on school grounds before school, during lunch, study hall period and after school. Cell phone use is prohibited in classrooms, restrooms, and school offices. During the instructional day, cell phones must remain in silent mode.

At the start of each class period, students will turn in their cell phone into their assigned caddie slot. They will not remain in students' pockets or backpacks. The cell phone will remain in the caddie for the duration of the class period. Teachers will prompt students to turn in their cell phone and when it will be the appropriate time to collect their device.

Cell phones must be placed in the cell phone caddie for each instructional class period. Teachers will review their procedure for collecting cell phones as well as where the caddie is located within the classroom. Students will not take their cell phone with them if they have permission to leave the class; ie - bathroom break, called to the guidance office or main offices. If students are leaving the school day early, they can collect their cell phone by alerting the teacher before they leave the classroom. If students need to place an emergency phone call during the day, they should request to go to the main office to use an office phone.

Students may be subject to disciplinary action if their use of their cell phones disrupts the school's educational environment. Examples of this include, but are not limited to: cheating, bullying, harassment, unlawful recording or photographing, refusing to follow teacher procedures, and violating other school rules.

PSAT/NMSQT Important Information

FOR 10TH & 11TH GRADERS

The digital PSAT/NMSQT will be administered on Thursday, October 24, 2024 from 8:10 AM to 11AM at OFHS. College bound 10th and 11th grade students are encouraged to test. Students should bring their chromebook, fully charged, and are allowed to bring their own calculator.

Deadline to register is Friday September 13th, 2024

Students are dismissed from school upon completion of the PSAT test. Buses will be available and will run at normal times before and after school. Any student needing a ride home will be placed in a study hall until bus dismissal after school. Students who receive testing accommodations will receive additional communication with specific testing information and approximate end times. Optional lunch will be provided at the conclusion of the test.

****10th and 11th grade students** who do not register to take the PSAT/NMSQT **DO NOT** need to report to OFHS on Thursday, October 24, 2024. Polaris students who choose not to take the PSAT/NMSQT will still need to report to Polaris on Thursday, October 24, 2024 We will notify Polaris of the Polaris juniors who are registered for the test and are excused from Polaris. Any Polaris junior not taking the PSAT/NMSQT does not report to the high school but will still report to Polaris.

Reasons to take the PSAT

- Practice for college admissions tests.
- Score indicates how your student would perform on a college admission test.
- Results indicate areas of strength and improvement.
- Free test prep is provided after the test results are released.

- Juniors test for entrance into the National Merit Scholarship Competition as well as millions of dollars in other scholarship opportunities.

How to sign- up

Students will bring a Check or Cash to Mrs. Kaminski in the Main Office. The cost of the test is \$18.00. Students need to bring **exact change** if paying with cash. Checks can be made out to Olmsted Falls High School. The cost of the test can also be applied to your student's school fees for those that need to pay via credit card, however you MUST still come to the Main Office to register before the 9/13 deadline. **If you applied this year and were approved for free/reduced lunch, please have your child contact Mr. Alex Lintner in the OF Guidance Department for help with registering for the PSAT/NMSQT prior to registration deadline. **Deadline to register is Friday September 13th, 2024 CollegeBoard does not accept late registrations**

12TH GRADE STUDENTS

12th grade students will NOT report to the building on Thursday, October 24, 2024. Seniors are encouraged to use this time to visit college/university campuses and explore career opportunities.

PSAT FOR 9TH GRADERS

9th grade students will report to the building on Thursday, October 24, 2024. 9th grade students will be given the PSAT 8/9 on October 24th. There is no pre-registration or cost to take the PSAT 8/9. A detailed schedule and outline for the day will be sent, via an eblast, to all 9th grade families. Students are dismissed from school upon completion of the PSAT test. Buses will be available and will run at normal times before and after school. Any student needing a ride home will be placed in a study hall until bus dismissal after school. Students who receive testing accommodations will receive additional communication with specific testing information and approximate end times. Optional lunch will be provided at the conclusion of the test.

OFHS Late Start - Student PLC's Schedule

Oftentimes, grade level meetings are held for students during the school day, disrupting the learning environment and educational process. To solve this issue we are conducting seven late starts to conduct required and or meaningful grade level meetings. *Attendance is mandatory.* This will allow us to maintain the 8 period school day and conduct grade level meetings. In the table below is the list of dates that students will report to school at 8:10 am. The grades not listed on each day will officially start their school day at 9:30 am. Topics will include internet/social media safety, college application process, career exploration/Naviance and Polaris. Transportation on PLC days will be provided for both the 8:10 am and 9:30 am start times. Normal bus runs will occur for the students that are reporting at 8:10 am for their PLC then a secondary bus run will occur for students starting the day at 9:30 am. The second round of buses will leave the bus garage at 8:45 am. This is the same process of transportation we do on our late start state testing days. Only the students in the left column will report to school for 8:10 am start.

Student Pickup and Dropoff

During the morning arrival, all students should be dropped off at the athletic entrance at the side of the building. During dismissal all students will be picked up at the athletic entrance at the side of the building. During dismal students will not be permitted to exit the building via the front doors. <u>Only bus riders will enter and exit the building via the main entrance doors</u>. **THIS IS FOR STUDENT SAFETY** and to allow our buses a safe passageway in our narrow driveway. New signs are posted to help remind parents of the proper drop off and pick up of students. The far west drive is a one way street for entering the parking lot only. At no times should this be used as an exit. Students caught using this to exit school grounds may have their parking privileges revoked.
