Midland had six runners finish with medalist honors and an amazing eighteen of the team's twenty-six runners earned new lifetime best times. Cameron Cochran, Andrew Worsley, Logan Bellinger, Spencer Porritt, and Landon Ferren were the scoring runners for the Chemics with Matthew Berg also earning medalist honors. Congrats to Adam Ogamba and Dom Heires for each knocking over a minute off their previous personal bests!

Varsity Volleyball Finishes Second at Flushing Tournament on Sat. Sept. 7<sup>th</sup>. The Varsity Volleyball team competed, taking second place at the Flushing Volleyball Tournament on Saturday Sept. 7<sup>th</sup>. In pool play, Midland beat Birch Run 25-15, 25-20; then beat Swartz Creek 25-17, 25-19. In the third match, Midland defeated Goodrich 25-15, 25-14 to advance to the Gold bracket. In the gold bracket semifinals, Midland beat Wixom St. Catherine Academy 2-1, with scores 25-19, 22-25, and the decisive game 3, 15-7; then lost to Flushing 19-25, 20-25 in the finals. Team went 4-1 on the day so current team record is now 6-3.
