Calabasas High School is a public high school school in the Las Virgenes Unified School District. We are situated in the western end of the San Fernando Valley in Los Angeles County, CA. ACADEMIC CURRICULUM

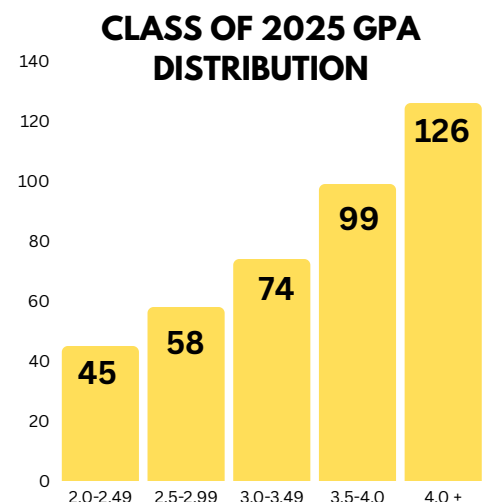

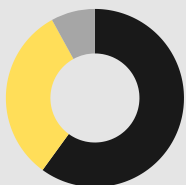
CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION

The Career Technical Education (CTE) programs of study involve multiyear sequences of courses that integrate core academic knowledge with technical and occupational knowledge to provide students with a pathway to postsecondary education and careers. Careers such as computer technology, investments, video and television production, culinary arts, and engineering/robotics trades are explored through CTE and elective courses. In addition, entertainment industry specific coursework includes Set Design, Lighting, Performance Production and Costume and Make-Up Design. All CTE courses have been approved by the University of California A-G system to satisfy subject requirements.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

Calabasas High School is home to a thriving student life experience. During the school day, students are able to take a variety of electives including Yearbook, Journalism, and Student Government. CHS has vigorous music and theater programs that offer multiple course levels.
