The Greater Rochester Community

With thirteen elementary schools, four middle schools, three traditional high schools, one alternative high school, and one childcare center, approximately 14,881 students residing in the greater Rochester area have the advantage of receiving a world-class education. The district is comprised of 561 acres of property encompassing 66 square miles, primarily in the City of Rochester Hills, the City of Rochester, and Oakland Charter Township.

The well-established communities of Rochester and Rochester Hills include approximately 89,335 residents with a median household income of \$91,929. A combination of rural and suburban settings, as well as close proximity to Oakland University, Ascension Providence Rochester Hospital, and the Detroit Metropolitan area, has attracted business professionals and families who enjoy the area's wide array of recreational and cultural activities.
