As always, the philanthropic year began with the Annual Fund. The cornerstone of fundraising at Woodland, the Annual Fund plays a pivotal role, contributing 6% to our operating budget. It bridges the gap between tuition and the true cost of a Woodland education, ensuring every student thrives.

We are grateful that a record 92% of families in our community participated in the 2023 Annual Fund. Together, these gifts of all sizes made a real difference, resulting in nearly \$925,000 for Woodland and demonstrating broad-based support for our work to educate the whole child.

In the spring, Woodland's Gala & Auction brought our community together for an annual night of celebration and philanthropy. Sincere gratitude goes out to all donors and our dedicated Gala & Auction committee for making the Starlight Gala a resounding success, with proceeds lighting the way to our work to enhance our science programs and spaces.

Next time you're on campus, peek into our renovated Lower School and Middle School science classrooms to see students at work in flexible, updated spaces that support advanced coursework and differentiated learning opportunities. Later this fall, we are eager to unveil The Wonder Cove, a geodesic greenhouse and outdoor learning space for ECE students.

Throughout the year, Woodland made substantial progress on our five-year Strategic Plan, *Inspired Voice: Meaningful Impact*. The generosity of our community provided vital financial support for strategic plan goals, both through our annual fundraising programs and thanks to leadership donors who stepped forward with vision and generosity to support specific initiatives.

As Woodland continues to advance our strategic plan, we look forward to sharing more information about ways philanthropic support can further strengthen the school's financial foundation and position Woodland to move forward with confidence and purpose in coming years.

Ramzi Ramsey

As Woodland Treasurer, I am pleased to provide this summary of the school's financial performance for the 2023-2024 school year.

Woodland's financial position continues to be solid with strong enrollment across the three divisions. Extended Day and Enrichment Programs continued to serve families in our community and, combined with stable enrollment, favorable interest income, and one-time grant funding, resulted in an overall 6% increase in revenue.



Successful fundraising programs resulted in the second highest donated revenue in Woodland history. The strength of our community was demonstrated in record parent participation and total number of donors to the Annual Fund. Together, donations to the Annual Fund combined with Gala & Auction proceeds resulted in over \$1.2 million in support of Woodland. This year's initiative, which included renovating both science classrooms, plus installation of The Wonder Cove for Early Childhood students, was generously underwritten by auction proceeds and Fund A Need contributions. I extend my thanks for this incredible generosity.

These fundraising results, along with rigorous expense management, and prudent financial controls ensured Woodland once again closed the fiscal year on budget. Thanks to this strong execution, Woodland was able to advance several key initiatives. Successful completion of our solar installation not only supported Woodland's sustainability efforts, but also reduced our utility bill by 17%—despite inflation and spiraling energy costs. Moreover, Woodland reached a significant milestone by fully retiring its long-term gym debt in fiscal 2024.


I also applaud Woodland for a successful first year of implementing our five-year Strategic Plan, *Inspired Voice: Meaningful Impact.* Thanks to our community's generous support of BASIS during the 2022-2023 school year, Woodland invested over \$60,000 in stipends for faculty who stepped forward to lead Strategic Plan initiatives. These roles included facilitating a DEIJ audit, examining alternative tuition models, exploring service partnerships with Bay Area organizations, and evolving our assemblies to a new Community Gathering model. In addition, I extend acknowledgement to the donors whose lead gifts support the Strategic Plan goal to ensure a sustainable future for Woodland.


Finally, the successful renewal of our Conditional Use Permit was a top priority for our Head of School and Board of Trustees throughout the 2023-2024 school year. This process was realized through many people's incredible commitment of both time and expertise. As Dr. Warren shared, we are pleased with the 10-year renewal approved by San Mateo County, and are appreciative for the cooperation with the Ladera community. Of note, this was also an expensive process that required extensive legal expertise.

Maintaining our secure financial position requires a steadfast commitment to sound fiscal stewardship and the unwavering support of our generous donors.

Every contribution, of every size, sustains our progress and supports our plans for the future. With the continued partnership of our community, we can solidify our financial standing and ensure Woodland remains a place where our children flourish and reach their full potential.





Impact of Your Support - GALA & AUCTION

Each year, proceeds from the Gala & Auction support priorities that go beyond what the Annual Fund makes possible. Over the summer, Woodland put auction bids and Fund A Need gifts to work on a holistic upgrade to our science spaces and programs.

Demolition began Monday after graduation and by 4th of July new flooring was laid in the Lower School and Middle School science classrooms. New cabinet installation followed, providing quick access to the tools and technology for advanced experiments and interactive learning experiences. Fresh counters and lab stations were up next, followed by modular tables that flex for both individual experimentation and collaborative team projects. The finishing touch was installation of 21 new windows providing enhanced natural light.

Immediately following Conditional Use Permit approval in June, Woodland submitted the permit application for The Wonder Cove. In parallel, site preparation plans were laid. Most exciting, Woodland prepared orders for 67 lineal feet of planter boxes and designed planting plans integrated with Early Childhood's hands-on, experiential science program. Scheduled for completion in this Fall, The Wonder Cove will extend existing and new Early Childhood curricula related to gardening and sustainability.
