A. REGULAR SESSION

- 1. **Call to Order**: The Regular Session of the Philomath School District Board of Directors was called to order by Board Vice Chair Erin Gudge at 7:01 pm on August 22, 2024 at the Philomath School District Boardroom located at 1620 Applegate Street. Those in attendance included Philomath School District Board of Directors Joe Dealy, Sandi Hering, Erin Gudge, and Ryan Cheeke; Superintendent Susan Halliday; Business Manager Jennifer Griffith, and Executive Assistant Michele McRae. Rick Wells was absent.
 - i. Pledge of Allegiance: Director Hering led us in the Pledge of Allegiance.
 - ii. **Approval of Consent Agenda**: Director Hering moved to approve the consent agenda as presented. Director Cheeke seconded the motion, and the Board approved the motion unanimously. Motion passes 4-0.
 - iii. **Request for Agenda Modifications**: Director Gudge requested that C3: OSBA LGBTQ2IA+ be added to the agenda, and she requested a construction update from the Superintendent.
 - iv. **Public Comment**: Clyde Rood, from the Lebanon School District School Board, asked for everyone's support in the upcoming District 10 Board Nominations. He spoke about the recent addition to the state school fund.

B. **REPORTS**

1. Association Reports

- i. **PEA**: Nicole Stueve was present at the meeting, but due to the summer break, there was no news to report.
- ii. **OSEA**: No report tonight.
- 2. **Superintendent's Report**: Superintendent Halliday reported that on August 8th and 9th, the administration met at a retreat, and they were able to discuss many topics, and it was very beneficial to the team. She also gave an update on registration numbers, the status of the road construction, the plan for in-service week, and updates on pre-schools in Philomath.

- 3. **Financial Report**: Business Manager, Jennifer Griffith, reported that in the Board packet, a letter from the auditor's states that they will begin their pre-audit work in the District. She said that the ending fund balance is higher compared to the past few years, and it will help offset some positions formerly paid for with ESSER funds that are being absorbed by the general fund. She included a list of summer projects that facilities completed, and she let everyone know that next month's financial reports will have a different format.
- 4. **English Learners Annual Report**: The English Learners Annual Report from the Oregon Department of Education was included in the Board packet, and Superintendent Halliday explained how it applies to Philomath School District.

c. STRATEGY AND DISCUSSION

- 1. **Inservice Week Updates**: Superintendent Halliday presented the plan for the District during in-service week during her report.

Board Members:

The new school year is off and running!

We are monitoring enrollment closely after the first weeks of attendance. At the close of the first week we are down in enrollment approximately 28 students compared to last year at this time. Enrollment numbers are below the estimate that was submitted for State School Fund payments for 2024-25. We may need to adjust our enrollment for funding purposes so that we are not overpaid from the State School Fund.

The Financial reports include a new Cash Flow chart. This chart projects our cash flow throughout the year, which fluctuates depending on when the bulk of our revenue comes in. State School Fund revenue is a set monthly payment throughout the year, but Property Tax revenue is very cyclical. We receive the bulk of Property Tax revenue in November/December. You can see from the chart a large jump is overall cash balance, that then declines throughout the rest of the year.


The other financial report included in the board packet shows current year to date revenue and expenditures compared to the same month as prior year. Current full year budgetary projections are not reliable until we process the first full payroll in September, so the October financial reports will contain projection numbers for 2024-25.



Revenue Insight:

General Fund (Source 54XX Removed) YTD revenues totaled \$4,261,306 through August 2024, which is \$479,342 or 11.2% more than the amount received last year for this period. The YTD difference is driven by an increase in 3000-3999 State Sources of \$486,280, a decrease in 1000-1999 Local Sources of -\$7,479, and an increase in 2000-2999 Intermediate Sources of \$541.



Expense Insights:

General Fund YTD expenses totaled \$1,853,072 through August 2024, which is \$183,682 or 9.9% more than the amount spent last year for this period. The YTD difference is driven by an increase in 300-399 Purchased Services of \$91,601, an increase in 100-199 Salaries of \$38,534, and an increase in 600-699 Other Objects of \$34,633.



A teacher is defined as a teacher, head teacher, special education teacher, or special education physical education teacher.








