Technical Theatre

This course explores the definition, design, and use of technical elements associated with theatre sets, props, costumes, makeup, lights, and sound. It introduces aspects of student design, creation of lighting, sound, properties, costumes, and make-up design while offering opportunities to apply skills in these areas. This course includes in-depth exploration of light operation, sound operation, stage management, costume construction, set development, meak-up and production staff.

Course Objectives

- Explore and utilize the elements of design and principles of composition for theatrical context
- Create basic to advanced technical elements by choosing appropriate materials, tools and techniques.
- Identify, explain, and demonstrate standard safety guidelines and operating procedures for tools and equipment used in formal and informal Theatre productions.
- Evaluate design choices of professional designers.
- Explore and understand the collaborations between designers and directors to develop design elements.
