What is it?	Santa Rita Elementary is committed to our vision: Excellence for All. Parents and family members of children receiving Title I, Part A services shall be involved in the decisions regarding how funds reserved for PFE activities are allotted for parental involvement activities.

No matter the teacher, each child is assessed via the same assessment provided by MISD which models each assessment after the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness or STAAR test. Previous STAAR tests are released which are utilized for</p>



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	assessment and instruction in addition to other curriculums.

Each child has a folder where teachers help them track their own learning growth.
