Faculty Spotlight

Rebecca and Brad Rausch '95

Long-time faculty members Rebecca and Brad Rausch '95 know firsthand the importance of teaching students with language-based learning differences. "I've always wanted to give back to the school that gave me so much and taught me to overcome my difficulties," said Brad, an alumnus, Chair of Gow's Science Department, and Director of Gow's Outdoor Education Program. "It's important to me to share my experiences with future generations," he said.

Brad's path to Gow was similar to that of many current students. Originally from the Buffalo area, he attended The Nichols School, where he struggled until his father learned about The Gow School Summer Program. After a summer at Gow, he became a full-time student in 1990. "The structure and small classes suited me, and I took full advantage of the tutorial sessions and the opportunity to make new friends. I graduated in 1995 and went to St. Lawrence University, where I earned a biology degree with a computer science minor. I worked at Gow for five years and then got a master's in science education with a concentration in physics from Buffalo State University. I returned to Gow and have been teaching for 24 years," he said.

Rebecca teaches Reconstructive Language and recalls how they started their life together at Gow. They planned an outdoor wedding on campus, but rain moved the wedding indoors to the Reid Arts Center, where they married in the theater. "Gow is meaningful to us on so many levels. It's a tight-knit community where faculty appreciate each other. It is a perfect place to raise our children Isabell (14), Penelope (12), and Finley (9)," said Rebecca.

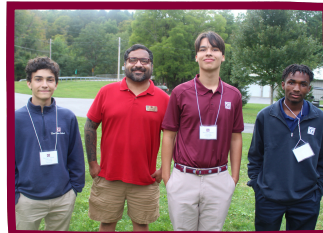

Noted Chef & Restaurateur

Gow alumnus, award-winning chef and restaurateur Matt Kelly '94 loves to bring friends and family together for fabulous food. As the owner of four restaurants in Raleigh-Durham, NC, Matt says, "My passion for food

has helped me understand cultures, be creative, and develop a passion for agriculture and farming," he said.

A proud Govian, Kelly is from Rochester, NY, and attended Gow for four years, graduating in 1994. While attending Appalachian State University, he worked at a restaurant and fell in love with cooking. He attended the Culinary Institute of America (CIA) and worked in top-rated restaurants, including The Inn at Little Washington in Virginia, before moving to the NC Triangle in 2002. With over thirty years of restaurant experience, Matt is the chef and partner of four acclaimed restaurants (Vin Rouge, Mateo, Nana's, and Mothers & Sons) in Durham. His accolades include the James Beard Award nominations and write-ups in The New York Times and Food & Wine.

"Gow gave me the opportunity to learn and live in an environment designed to provide students with as many opportunities as possible. I loved Outdoor Education and mountain biking, and living with students from around the world fostered strong relationships with faculty and staff that go beyond academics," he said.

Kelly lives with his wife, Elizabeth, and 18-month-old daughter, Maple, on a farm with 300 chickens and 100 pigs, and he uses much of the produce he grows in his restaurants. He works with many charitable organizations, including the Frankie Lemmon School and Developmental Center and Families Moving Forward, and helps other restaurateurs start businesses.

Matt remains an avid supporter of Gow, hosting events and contributing to the Gow auction. "Hosting events for Gow and supporting the school are important ways for me to give back and something I love being a part of. I'm always eager to tell potential students about my Gow experiences and to share this advice: maintain a positive attitude, work hard, and take advantage of all the activities. Make the most of being in a special place with dedicated teachers and a beautiful environment."
