The communities of Papillion and La Vista are a part of the greater Omaha metropolitan area, with an approximate combined population of over 40,000. This year, serving just over 12,039 students, we are the fourth largest district in Nebraska. There are sixteen elementary schools (Pre-K-6), three middle schools (7-8), and two high schools (9-12). 

GRADING SYSTEM



Mark points are assigned to various courses to differentiate the difficulty of each course. 
