Board Items

Real World Learning Update

Pam Lewis, associate superintendent of leadership and learning, introduced Dr. Ryan Flurry, principal of career education campuses, and Laura Harsch, business to education program officer, to present an update on Real World Learning in the Shawnee Mission School District.

Dr. Flurry shared how Real World Learning connects to the [Strategic Plan](#) in the strategy areas of Learning and Belonging. The Strategic Plan states that every student will have a personalized learning plan, which will prepare them for college and careers, with the interpersonal skills they need for life success.

Since 2019-2020, Real World Learning has been part of a regional effort, in collaboration with the Kauffman Foundation and other districts across the Kansas City metro area. The initiative now spans 75 high schools across more than 31 school districts, reaching over 80,000 students. Dr. Flurry

noted this is the last year of grant support for SMSD by the Kauffman Foundation.

A key focus of Real World Learning has been on student attainment of Market Value Assets (MVAs), which include work opportunities and certifications that help students succeed beyond high school. The four categories of MVAs are entrepreneurial experiences, work experience (internships and client connected projects), nine or more college credit hours, and industry recognized credentials. The district aims for 100% of students to graduate with an MVA by 2028. Dr. Flurry shared data showing 72.8% of the current class of 2024 has earned an MVA.

Erica Jablonski, real world learning counselor, and Grayson Furjanic, SM West senior, shared their experiences with client-connected projects in collaboration with The History Co: Lab and the Overland Park Chamber of Commerce. Ashley Ardon Baltazar, SM South junior, spoke about her internship with the Immigrant Connection.

Ms. Lewis shared that looking ahead, SMSD will continue expanding Real World Learning opportunities by enhancing career exploration from Pre-K to 12th grade, supporting the costs of Real World Learning experiences, integrating Real World Learning with core content, developing comprehensive communications strategies and developing systems to ensure its sustainability.

Student Athletic Participation

Kent Glaser, director of athletics and activities, presented an update on athletic participation in the Shawnee Mission School District. He opened the presentation by sharing an article connecting participation in athletics to the five “C’s” of competence, confidence, connections, character and caring.

He highlighted that participation numbers across schools continue to rise, with the expansion of middle school programs playing a key role. At the high school level, interest in athletics remains strong, with participation numbers continuing to grow. Glaser emphasized the importance of encouraging student involvement, noting that research consistently links participation in school programs with academic success.

Gonser for a discussion about the process and what is next with the work of the Strategic Plan. [Click here to watch or listen!](#)



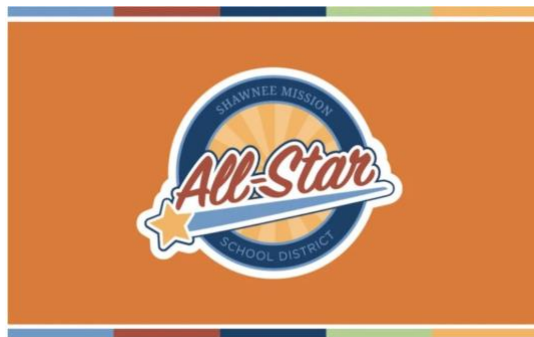
Faculty Art Show Announcement
