Presentation

Ms. Acevedo and Ms. Armmento presented an overview of the Seal of Bi-literacy Credential Program administered by the State of New Jersey. Certificates from the district were presented to the students.

Superintendent's Report

Acting Superintendent Report/Curriculum Report

- **NJSBOE Student Recognition Program:** Each spring, the New Jersey State Board of Education recognizes students or student groups who have made a significant contribution to their schools, communities, families, or other organizations. On March 29th, our district nominated the NPHS Canuck Mentors to receive this honor. This year in addition to their work mentoring freshmen, the Canuck Mentors took the initiative to create a student-led memorial honoring the lost lives of students from Parkland High School. If chosen, the Canuck Mentors will be honored in Trenton in mid-May.
- **Transition Planning Targeted Review:** The federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) requires each state to have in place a State Performance Plan and to file an Annual Performance Report evaluating the state's implementation of IDEA. This year, the New Jersey Office Special Education has selected our district, along with several others, to participate in the 2018 targeted review for compliance with age 16 transition planning requirements for students with IEPs (Indicator #13). The purpose of this review is to ensure that our school district is conducting appropriate activities to facilitate the successful transition of our students with disabilities to post-secondary education, employment, and adult life in the community. Five of our students have been selected randomly, and
our Director of Special Services will provide the required documentation to the State in order to comply with this review.
- **FBI Presentations:** The final FBI cyber safety presentations of the school year were given to Middle School students on March 28th and 29th, and ninth grade students on April 9th. This concludes the FBI programming for the 2017-2018 school year. In total, Special Agents spent five full days with small groups of students and one evening with parents. Feedback from these events has been overwhelmingly positive. We hope to continue this partnership next year.
- **QSAC Update - 40% Rise in I&P:** I am proud to share the good news that the District has passed the QSAC Instruction and Program (I&P) with a score of **80 percent!** This is a 40% rise from 2013-2014 when North Plainfield received a county QSAC score of 41% in Instruction and Program, which resulted in the district being placed on a District Improvement Plan (DIP). Each year, we have been reevaluated and our scores have been showing demonstrated growth. This year, an equivalency was written to request we be evaluated on the 2018-2019 I&P document for QSAC. After a visit from the county representatives, and deep dive into our data, curriculum, and program, I am proud to share that we scored an 80%; removing the need for a DIP. This score is the result of persistent and focused work with steady measures of growth. The work required the collaborative effort of dedicated educators to make it a reality. This is a team success. I encourage the entire district to pause, as I did when the news was

shared, and acknowledge the commitment expressed in our score. My sincerest gratitude goes to our teachers, staff, and administrators for their tireless efforts and daily focus on the development of students.

- **District Security:** There was a District Security Meeting presentation about NPPD partnership, and a presentation regarding the plans will be on April 25th during the Board meeting.
- **Arts Festival:** Please join us for the District Arts Festival on April 12th at the middle school and high school.
- **Middle School Parent Cyber Night:** On April 19th, the Middle School will host a cyber night for parents. This Ed Camp style program will allow parents to rotate through four presentations facilitated by students: Facebook, Snapchat, Instagram, and Safety Tips. Students content experts will demonstrate how to set up accounts and navigate each application, discuss the positives and negatives of each, and alert parents to potential hazards. Parent interest has been high in this area, and we look forward to a well-attended, successful evening.
