## Wildly Important Goal #1: 80% of Students Make One Year's Worth of Growth

- Helton shared the last three year's worth of STAAR scores for Math, Reading, and Science
- Interventions have started in grades 3-5 for Math and Reading to help close gaps for students, and 1-2 grades are doing small groups during their Math and Reading blocks
- Helton asked if teachers have suggestions for further training needed. No suggestions
  were given. Teachers did share that the resources for reading are overwhelming. There are
  too many resources. Lack of resources to have in the students hands to use to annotate
  and read from.

## Wildly Important Goal #2: 97% Attendance

Campus Improvement Plan-Helton
