#### ABOUT THE YRBS

- ▶ The YRBS is administered every two years throughout the nation.
- The survey is anonymous.
- All responses are "self-reported."
- Parents are sent information about the YRBS before each administration.
  - Survey uses passive consent Parents can ask that their student NOT participate.
  - Parents can view the questions on the School District of Marshfield Website.
  - Students can also opt out of the survey.

### ABOUT THE 2021 DATA

- Marshfield Middle School Grades 7 and 8 participants = 512 (83%)
- Marshfield High School Grades 9 through 12 participants = 1015 (83%)
- Data presented is from the YRBS given in October 2021.
- All data is shown as PERCENTAGES.
- Middle School and High School staff received a brief/basic YRBS presentation this fall.
- The 2019 Board Presentation and the posted YRBS information was a combination of School District of Marshfield and Columbus.
- ► This 2021 YRBS presentation is School District of Marshfield only data.

### COMPARISONS


- ▶ 2019 Data for MMS is only 8<sup>th</sup> Grade 2021 is 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Grade.
- Wood County data is available at the HS level only.
- Wisconsin data was provided in a different format only directly comparable data shown.
- National data is anticipated in late fall 2022.
- We receive cleaned and weighted data not raw data.














































