I'd like to first introduce myself as the Interim Director of Special Education for Mashpee this year. I've met many of you over the last 15 years as the School Psychologist and Special Education Team Chairperson at the Quashnet School and I'm thrilled to be able to work with you for one more year.

This is a big year for special education in Massachusetts, as the state has adopted a new IEP format which is more student-focused and strengths-based. This means that the IEP you create this year at your child's Annual Review will look quite different. Our special educators have participated in training to navigate this new document and are prepared to roll out this new IEP. I'll also be sharing a video walkthrough of the new IEP later this month so you, too, are prepared for this change.

As a parent or guardian of a child with a disability, you are invited to participate in our Special Education Parent's Advisory Council (SEPAC). Throughout the year, the SEPAC hosts speakers and shares information and support. The first meeting of the Mashpee SEPAC will be focused on Basic Rights - look for the announcement soon!
