

The Tooele County School District will facilitate training for staff on the Emergent 3 (E3) platform and incorporate the platform into our emergency response drills for the year.

Standard safety and security procedures will benefit stakeholders in the event of an emergency giving reassurance that the Tooele County School District is providing a safe learning environment for all students.

- Ensure all staff have access either through the mobile app or desktop software to the E3 emergency response system
- Provide staff and administrators training on the use of E3 and how it functions
- Conduct monthly drills using the E3 platform across the district
- Continually evaluate the use and effectiveness of the software platform and make adjustments as necessary



Tooele County School District will improve system-to-system communication between various department software programs.

Curriculum, Instruction, Assessment



Our Teaching and Learning Department focused on enhancing the quality and consistency of instruction across the district through targeted initiatives and collaborative efforts. They conducted calibration visits across the district, collaborating with school administrators to align classroom practices with district standards and build stronger connections between schools and district leaders.

Key highlights include:

- Updated nearly all curriculum guides to align with Utah Core standards, now serving as TCSD unit guidelines.
- Boosted kindergarten literacy proficiency from 51% in September to 69% in December with the support of our literacy coaches.
- Adopting a new K-12 math program after an in-depth evaluation and stakeholder input.

Our approach to improving curriculum, instruction, and assessment is built around a structured three-phase model. Through these



focused efforts, we are ensuring every classroom benefits from consistent, high-quality instruction that drives student success.

Safe and Orderly Environment

Student safety remains a top priority for Tooele County School District, and this past year, we have taken significant steps to enhance our security and preparedness. Our efforts have been focused on refining safety protocols and ensuring every aspect of our safety infrastructure is robust and effective. The following is a highlight of some of those achievements.

- Monthly Drills: We conducted regular drills to standardize safety routines across the district. These exercises helped everyone; administrators, teachers, and students understand and follow consistent procedures during emergencies.
- Safety Evaluations: We performed routine safety checks at each school, which led to securing grant funding for security improvements.
- Communication Enhancements: The evaluations also revealed the need for better communication tools. As a result, we acquired more radios and a dedicated emergency response program to streamline communication across the district.
- School Safety Specialists: In response to a legislative mandate, we designated School Safety Specialists in every school by October 1, 2023. These specialists received training in the Standard Response Protocol, the Standard Reunification Method, and participated in the School Safety Academy. Additional training this summer further strengthened their skills.






Systems of Operation

Dual Language Immersion

Bridge Program

The DLI Bridge Program is an incredible opportunity designed to bridge the gap between students who have passed the AP test and their journey into higher education. This unique program offers three 3000-level college credit courses; an opportunity unmatched in any other content area. Notably, Utah stands as the only state with a bridge program that has an agreement with all public universities to accept these credits toward college graduation. By participating in the Bridge Program, our students can complete their high school careers just a few classes short of earning a minor in their language. Beyond academics, these students emerge as bilingual and biliterate, equipping them with skills that will open doors and create opportunities in their future careers and personal lives.


Wendover High School - Spanish



Installed smart irrigation clocks at several schools to manage water usage more efficiently.



Improved lighting control with new panels at multiple schools, enhancing management and efficiency.



Professionally tuned all district boilers, establishing a baseline for ongoing maintenance and improved gas efficiency.
