Reminder



We want to start the school year off right by reminding our students of our policy regarding toys and personal items, which can be found on page 13 of the Lincoln-McKinley Student/Parent Handbook: <a href="TOYS/PERSONAL ITEMS">TOYS/PERSONAL ITEMS</a>: Students are not to bring toys or trading cards to school. Expensive toys and any electronic devices are not allowed at school at any time. Cell phone usage will not be allowed during the school day. If your child should bring a cell phone to school, it must remain in his or her backpack during the school day. The School District is not responsible for theft or damage of private property.

PERSONAL TECHNOLOGY: iPads, tablets, Kindles, and similar devices may be allowed by the classroom teacher for educational applications, but the parent/student accepts the risk of damage or theft. Cell phones, tablets, laptop computers, laser pens, and other electronic devices that distract from the educational process will not be allowed during the school day. Cell phones, smart watches, Gizmos and/or other electronic devices must be put away and turned to quiet mode during the school day which runs from 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM. At no time will any student operate a cell phone or other electronic device with video capabilities in the bathroom, or other location where such operation may violate the privacy rights of another person. Unauthorized use is grounds for confiscation by school personnel.

#### Support Fridays

Lincoln-McKinley Support Fridays, though optional, are academic based. We will be teaching reading, math, and STEM along with rotations of PE, music, library and counseling. These Fridays, from 8 AM-12 PM, are a wonderful opportunity for students to continue learning and building foundation skills. If students are signed up for busing for the 24-25 school year, the buses will pick them up at their regularly scheduled time and place and return them to their drop off location after school is dismissed. Breakfast and lunch will be provided during these Support Fridays. Attendance on Support Fridays will not impact their daily attendance record.



#### After-School Change of Plans

If you need to change your child's afterschool plans, we prefer you send a note to school with your child. If for some reason there is a last-minute change, please call the school office before 2:00 PM.





Your child's safety is most important. Please use the crosswalks when dropping off and picking up.

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#### Absence Requests

Parents and guardians can use the Absence Request tool in the Infinite Campus Parent Portal to submit a request that informs the office in advance when their student is not going to be in school. After logging into Parent Portal, open the menu, select "More" from the bottom of the menu list, then select "Absence Request" and fill in the information needed.



#### A Note from Our Counselors

Dear Families.

We want your child to be as successful as possible at school. Success in school is not just about reading and math. It is also about knowing how to learn and how to get along with others. We will be using the Second Step program in your child's classroom to teach these critical skills. The Second Step program teaches skills in the following four areas:

- 1. Skills for Learning: Students gain skills to help themselves learn, including how to focus their attention, listen carefully, use self-talk to stay on task, and be assertive when asking for help with schoolwork.
- 2. Empathy: Students learn to identify and understand their own and others' feelings.

  Students also learn how to take another's perspective and how to show compassion.
- 3. Emotion Management: Students learn specific skills for calming down when experiencing strong feelings, such as anxiety or anger.
- 4. Problem-Solving: Students learn a process for solving problems with others in a positive way.

Your child will be learning a lot this year and he or she will need your help! Throughout the year your child will be bringing home Home Links that go with several of the Second Step lessons. Home Links are simple, fun activities for you and your child to complete together. They are a great way for you to understand what your child is learning and for you to show you what he or she knows.
