In May 2024, 162 students took a total of 409 Advanced Placement Exams in 22 subjects. 88% of the students earned a passing score of 3 or higher.

At the conclusion of each academic year, grade point averages are calculated by assigning numerical points to each letter grade based on a 4.0 scale. The rigor of Honors and AP courses is considered the same; grades in each course receive an additional one-third extra point. The Pennington School does not rank its students.

CURRICULUM

The Pennington School offers a challenging college preparatory curriculum to all students. For the Class of 2025, Honors and Advanced Placement courses have been available as follows:

Honors: English I, American Identities, Literary Thesis; Geometry, Algebra I and II, Precalculus, Discrete Mathematics; Chemistry, Organic Chemistry, Biology, Physics; Data Structures and Algorithms; U.S. History, World History; Thesis Seminar; Chinese IV; German III and IV; French III and IV; Spanish II, III, IV, and Latino and Latinx Studies; Latin III and IV.

Advanced Placement: English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition; United States History, Macroeconomics and Microeconomics, United States Government and Politics, Modern European History; Statistics, Calculus AB and BC; Computer Science A; Latin V, French V, Spanish V, German V; Physics C, Chemistry, Biology; Studio Art, and Music Theory.

Cum Laude Society: The Pennington School chapter of the Cum Laude Society inducts the top ten percent of the senior class, as determined by grade point average, and the School views selection for membership as one of the highest honors it can confer.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To graduate, a student must have earned twenty credits, including four years of English; three years of mathematics; three years of history/social studies; three years of science (two years of lab science); two years of world language; two semesters each of religion/ethics and arts; one semester each of technology and health; and one quarter of public speaking.

DISTINCTIVE PROGRAMS

Applied Science Certificate in Computer Science, Innovation, and Engineering

The Applied Science Certificate in Computer Science, Innovation, and Engineering gives students in this two-year program many opportunities to take the strong skills they develop in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics and combine them with their capabilities in critical thinking, problemsolving, communication, and collaboration in order to innovate practical applications and real-world solutions. Program components include specialized and extended coursework, fieldwork, STEM experiences, participation in a speaker series with industry professionals, and a STEM-focused senior project.

Global Studies Certificate Program

The Global Studies Certificate Program offers an interdisciplinary academic and co-curricular environment in which students participate meaningfully to learn about and address global issues. Students in this two-year program develop their capacity to understand and act on topics of worldwide significance, broaden their outlook beyond Pennington's campus, and take their places as true global citizens. Program components include specialized and extended coursework, fieldwork, global experiences, participation in a global studies speaker series, and a globally-focused senior project.

The Edmund V. Cervone Center for Learning

The Edmund V. Cervone Center for Learning prepares students with diagnosed learning disabilities by offering compensatory skills and strategies for academic work. Students graduate from this program equipped with the knowledge and tools necessary to be successful in college and beyond.
