# NORWAY'S MAJESTIC COASTLINE & FJORDS:

A Voyage from the Arctic to Amsterdam

The spectacular coast of Norway is surely among the world's most beautiful cruise destinations. The scenery of Fjordland is breathtaking; the Norwegian Sea, like the people who inhabit its shores, is friendly; and the myriad small ports that welcome our calls are vibrant with Norway's distinctive culture. We are fortunate to have among our traveling companions Wellesley's popular faculty escort Claire Fontijn, the Phyllis Henderson Carey Professor of Music, who will help guests appreciate the art and music of Norway. Once again, our ship of choice is the elegant new expedition vessel, the 192-passenger Diana.

Your 10-night voyage begins high above the Arctic Circle in Tromsø, the sophisticated island city that serves as Norway's gateway to the Arctic. Nestled amidst the coastal range, Tromsø is a city of both legend and scenic wonder. Exploration of Norway's Northlands continues with the magnificent Trollfjord, the Lofoten Islands, and Svartisen Glacier. In the ancient port city of Trondheim, you'll visit the Ringve Museum, Norway's national museum for music and musical instruments. Following a glorious float through the Nordfjord, you will call at Bergen, "City of Seven Mountains," and once an important trading center for the Hanseatic League. Here, you'll visit the home of Norway's most famous composer Edvard Grieg. After calling at Ulvik, beloved by artists for its picturesque setting on the Hardangerfjord, you'll carry on to Mandal, Norway's southernmost city, before continuing to the Helgoland Islands, a German resort destination and ornithological paradise. With its delightful network of canals and renowned art museums, Amsterdam offers the perfect conclusion to your cruise itinerary.

Professor Claire Fontijn's talks on the music of Edvard Grieg, the paintings of Edvard Munch, and Norwegian folk music will surely deepen travelers' understanding of Norway's cultural heritage. Among Diana's many amenities is her spacious Observation Lounge with its enhanced technology for audio and visual presentations. The ship also has an excellent complement of presenters on a variety of topics relevant to the voyage.

Norway's Majestic Coastline & Fjords is an adventure that offers a rare combination of beautiful places, sublime music and art, and extraordinary comfort. Join the warm companionship of Wellesley alumnae and the enlightened leadership of Professor Fontijn on this breathtaking journey.

#### **CLAIRE FONTIJN**

Phyllis Henderson Carey Professor of Music




Claire Fontijn is Phyllis Henderson Carey Professor of Music at Wellesley College where she teaches courses on Early Music and The Symphony, and a writing seminar called The Power of Music. She is the author of four books: a monograph, Desperate Measures: the Life and Music of Antonia Padoani Bembo (2006; 2013); two sets of essays, Fiori Musicali: Liber Amicorum Alexander Silbiger (2010) and Uncovering Music of Early European Women (2020), and another monograph, The Vision of Music of Saint Hildegard's Scivias—Synthesizing Image, Text, Notation, and Theory (2013). Early in her career, she was an award-winning semi-professional baroque flutist; currently, she plays the Renaissance treble flute with the Wellesley College Collegium Musicum. She is an avid Europhile who has lived and worked in France, the Netherlands, and Italy.















**Built in Finland, and launched in April 2023, Swan Hellenic's** *Diana* is a new generation expedition cruise ship. Although at 12,100 tons the ship is large enough to accommodate more than 350 passengers, *Diana* will accommodate a maximum of 192 guests in 96 spacious staterooms and balcony suites. The low guest density results in one of the most generous indoor and outdoor space-to-guest ratios among cruise ships.

Featuring the latest advances in technology and engineering, *Diana* is among the world's first environmentally responsible ships. Equipped with hybrid engines and a unique water filtration system, *Diana* leaves a minimal footprint. For cruising in Polar regions, the ship meets the stringent requirements of the new Polar Code with its high PC5 Category A ice strengthened hull and other advanced features. A computer-controlled Dynamic Positioning System allows the ship to maintain position without anchoring. Operated by a complement of 135 experienced European officers and international crew members, *Diana* will

carry a fleet of Zodiacs, versatile landing boats, and kayaks. Powerful stabilizers provide a smooth ride.

Diana's interior spaces exude sophisticated elegance, with most rooms opening to panoramic views of the sea. All staterooms and suites face outside and are equipped with private facilities, climate control, TV, Wi-Fi and USB connections and other amenities. Of the ship's 96 staterooms, 76 have balconies. Public areas include a spacious observation lounge equipped with state-of- the-art facilities for lectures and presentations; a club lounge; a restaurant that accommodates all guests at one seating; an outdoor café/bar that surrounds the heated swimming pool; a wellness area with gym, spa, and sauna with an adjoining outdoor jacuzzi; library; beauty salon; and an infirmary that is attended by a full-time doctor and nurse. The ship also features expansive open-deck areas. Two elevators connect all decks. Attentive service is provided on a 24-hour basis. The outstanding cuisine is complemented by fine wines at lunch and dinner.





### Saturday, July 19, 2025 **DEPART THE UNITED STATES.**

#### Sunday, July 20

#### TROMSØ, NORWAY

Arrive in Tromsø and transfer to *Clarion Hotel The Edge* (or similar). Gather this evening for a welcome reception with fellow travelers. (D)

#### Monday, July 21

#### TROMSØ/EMBARKATION

After breakfast, explore this beautiful and vibrant city 220 miles north of the Arctic Circle. Begin with a visit to the Tromsø Polar Museum, housing a variety of natural history and ethnographic collections that provide a comprehensive introduction to traditional Norwegian culture, including an informative section on the Sami. Also tour the Arctic Cathedral—the city's iconic modern landmark—constructed in 1960 of concrete, aluminum and glass, and featuring a spectacular triangular stained-glass window that fills one entire wall. After lunch at a local restaurant, transfer to the pier to embark *Diana* and set sail. (B,L,D)

#### Tuesday, July 22

#### SVOLVÆR, LOFOTEN ARCHIPELAGO

After a morning of cruising the fjords south of Tromsø, call in the small town of Svolvær in the heart of the Lofoten Archipelago. A scenic drive through these rugged mountains rising out of the sea, brings you to the Lofotr Viking Museum, which tells the compelling story of a Viking settlement discovered here and excavated in the 1980s to reveal the remains of the largest Viking longhouse ever unearthed. The museum, which was opened in 1995, includes a full-scale reconstruction of the longhouse, two Viking ships, a movie theater, and a gift shop. (B,L,D)

#### Wednesday, July 23

#### **SVARTISEN | SVARTISEN GLACIER**

Svartisen is Norway's second largest glacier, its tongue jutting out between two mountains, its edges as much as 600 feet thick. Take the ship's Zodiacs to the Visitor Center and join a hike toward the glacier-formed lake. (B,L,D)

#### Thursday, July 24

#### **BRØNNØYSUND**

Arrive in the morning in Brønnøysund, located on a narrow peninsula, for centuries one of the key ports of the middle coast of Norway. Explore the interesting town on a walking tour which includes a handsome stone church constructed in the 12th century. Also visit the Norwegian Aquaculture Center, a fish farm employing the latest technologies of aquaculture, where you learn about the process. (B,L,D)

#### Friday, July 25

#### **TRONDHEIM**

The Viking town of Trondheim, founded in the 11th century, is one of northern Europe's famed "wooden cities," filled with colorful timber buildings. Tour Nidaros Cathedral, an important pilgrimage site in the Middle Ages as the burial site of Norway's patron saint, Olav, and visit the Archbishop's Palace, which contains one of the best museums in



Norway. After lunch, travel to the nearby Ringve Museum of Musical History, telling the story of the evolution of Norwegian music. (B,L,D)

#### Saturday, July 26

#### **NORDFJORDEID**

Nordjordeid is your gateway to Briksdal Glacier, part of the Jostedal ice field, the largest glacier on the European mainland. The drive to the glacier takes you through the villages of Loen and Stryn to a lodge where you board "troll cars" (7-passenger electric vehicles) that take you to within a half-mile's walk to the glacier's edge. (B,L,D)

#### Sunday, July 27

#### **BERGEN**

During your time in Bergen, you will enjoy a guided walking tour of Bryggen, the old waterfront wharf that serves as a reminder of the town's importance as part of the Hanseatic League's trading empire from the 14th to the mid-16th century. It is now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. You will also travel to nearby Troldhaugen, once the summer home of composer Edvard Grieg and now a museum and concert venue, and you will visit the Fantoft Stave Church, originally built in 1150 and reconstructed after a fire in 1992 exactly as it was in the 12th century. *Diana* remains at anchor until late in the evening, providing ample time, should you wish, to continue exploring this charming city on your own. (B,L,D)

#### Monday, July 28

#### **ULVIK**

The small community of Ulvik, known for its orchards, is situated at the end of an arm of Hardangerfjord, Norway's second longest fjord.

It is the starting point for a panoramic drive through a scenic valley to Voss, where a cable car takes you to the top of a hill 2,700 feet above sea level with 360-degree views of the surrounding countryside. In the afternoon, as you sail back up Hardangerfjord, you will want to be on deck to see Hardanger Bridge—at just under a mile, one of the world's longest suspension bridges. (B,L,D)

#### Tuesday, July 29

#### **MANDAL**

Mandal is the southernmost town in Norway, a community built on the banks of the Mandalselva River and surrounded by farmland. Visit a local farm, or spend time in the town, browsing its picturesque shops, cafés, and bakeries. (B,L,D)

#### Wednesday, July 30

#### HELGOLAND, GERMANY


The island of Helgoland, surrounded by jagged red sandstone cliffs, has been part of the German state of Schleswig-Holstein since 1890, ending periods of rule by Denmark and Britain. It was an important forward military outpost for the Germans in both World Wars and was nearly completely destroyed by British bombardment in 1945. It is now a peaceful retreat, home to large nesting sites for Kittiwakes and Guillemots. (B,L,D)

#### Thursday, July 31

#### AMSTERDAM/DISEMBARK

After breakfast aboard, disembark *Diana* and transfer to the airport for flights homeward. (B)





All accommodations aboard *Diana* are spacious staterooms and balcony suites. They are elegantly decorated, face outside, affording sea views, and include a queen-size bed that can be arranged as two twin beds, a spacious bathroom, minirefrigerator, safe, ample closet space, climate control, telephone, TV, Wi-Fi, and USB connections, as well as other amenities.


