Transportation Services:

1. Enter description of transportation services offered to pupils, and how it will prioritize planned transportation services for pupils in transitional kindergarten, kindergarten, and any of grades 1 - 6 inclusive and pupils who are low income. The Special Education Department provides a contracted service for all students in our Preschool through Transition to Adult programs free of charge. This service is offered to students who do not attend their homeschool, and for students who are not able to physically get to school independently and safely (walking, riding a bike). Our Student Services Department provides transportation support for sheltered and unsheltered students who fall under the the guidelines of the McKinney-Vento Act. This support includes bus passes, bikes, BART passes, and providing access to fuel for parent transportation.

2. Enter description of LEA's transportation services that would be accessible to pupils with disabilities, and homeless children and youth. For students with disabilities, the District contracts with a company that provides door-to-door transportation services. The service is provided by private vehicles as well as high occupancy vehicles. Drivers have background checks as well as training in working with students with disabilities.

For our students who are homeless, they are also provided access to transportation services. When parents choose to transport their students independently rather than accept the District's transportation services, parents can receive mileage reimbursement for transporting their students to and from school. From Student Services, bus and BART passes are available, bikes are donated, or parents are given access to fuel for their vehicles.

3. Enter description of how unduplicated pupils, would be able to access available home-to-school transportation at no-cost to the pupils.

The same transportation and resources available to students with disabilities and students who are homeless are available to unduplicated students. The Special Education Department and Student Services Department work together to determine how to best meet students' needs. The LEA also utilizes Child Welfare and Attendance (CWA) Specialists to support families with seeking out support and to provide access to resources that are available within the school District and county.

The McKinney-Vento Act requires that the transportation plan as well as other support services are communicated to staff, community agencies, and families that are experiencing homelessness.
