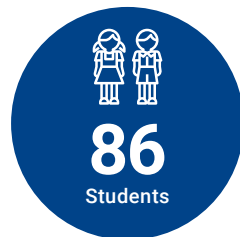


## Overview

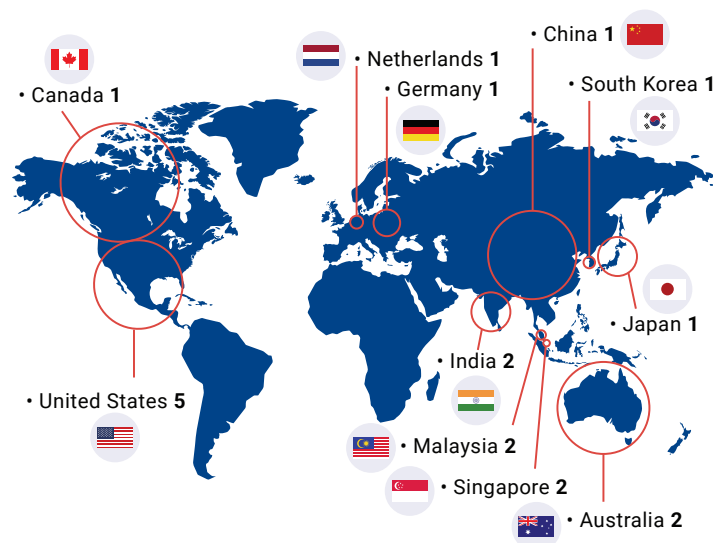
### SCHOOL & COMMUNITY

- Located on an 18,000 sqm campus in western Singapore, offering sports facilities, modern classrooms, and performing arts spaces
- Founded in 1993 as a non-profit American-curriculum school by missionaries and business leaders, growing from 16 students to over 400 by 2024
- 400+ students from 27 nationalities, PreK-12, with expatriate parents in industries like finance, education, business, petrochemicals, the US military, and government embassies
- Experienced faculty with 60 teachers from 10 countries, mostly US passport holders, averaging 11.3 years of experience, with 57% holding master's degrees or higher
- English fluency, WIDA testing, and math replacement tests are required for admission. English Language Learning and support services available
- Active parent organization coordinates many school events throughout the year
- Collaborates with local communities, special needs schools, elder care, and government for service projects

## Key Features

### WELL-ROUNDED CURRICULUM

- High School offers 66 courses in nine subjects; 25 credits needed for a diploma, including core subjects and electives
- All Grade 12 students complete a Senior Thesis, exploring their chosen field and presenting their findings

### SERVICE

- Service learning is central to our culture, promoting joyful, intentional service
- High school students lead service projects with middle school peers, benefiting communities in Singapore and Southeast Asia
- 6 hours of community service are required per semester to meet diploma requirements

### ATHLETICS & ACTIVITIES

- 20+ clubs and extra-curriculars, including local and international varsity sports
- Participation in ACSIS (Athletic Conference of Singapore International Schools) and ACSC (Asia Christian Schools Conference) Division II Tri-Sport competitions

# Advanced Placement Program

In 2024, 51 ICS students took 105 AP exams. Students take AP courses either at ICS or online through NorthStar Academy, an accredited American School.

## Standards-Based Learning and Assessment

ICS uses a standards-based approach for reporting student learning in the high school. In each course, teachers cover a variety of standards and rate student performance against grade-level standards based on the following scale.
