


Preliminary State Data by SCCOE Datazone

School Consolidation Advisory Committee

Why consolidation/closure?

- 1. Expiry and full **exhaustion of COVID19 funds**
- 2. **\$19.6m deficit** FY 2024-25
- 3. **CDE has amplified deficits** by passing burden to the local level
- 4. CDE/SCCOE sent **Fiscal Crisis & Management Assistance Team (FCMAT)** team to audit two weeks ago
- 5. Declining enrollment
 - a. Capacity for 16,000 students
 - b. 9 additional schools to be determined for consolidation/closure as part of the fiscal management mandate to correct the ARUSD deficit
 - a. 3 schools closed in last decade (Pala MS, Sloanaker ES, Chavez ES) and two Consolidated (Mathson MS & Fischer MS) already
 - c. Current enrollment 7,300 students
- 6. The **ARUSD School Board** will announce action to close/consolidate schools at the currently scheduled **December 5th board meeting**.



- School consolidation is part of the directive by SCCOE under CDE to balance the ARUSD budget deficit resulting from the expiration of COVID19 funding & declining enrollment.


