Early Childhood 1-2 has been hard at work preparing for their *Buddy* days. On buddy days, the high school students are paired with a preschool buddy from our center. They brainstorm ideas, create and prepare the project developmentally appropriate for the child, and then do it with the preschoolers. It's a really fun day!

Another thing the Early Childhood program has been working on is registering for Dual Enrollment credits through Rio Salado. Early Childhood has a special opportunity to receive a *First Things First* scholarship, which pays for all six of their credits in 1-2 and another six credits in 3-4. At the end of the program, students can earn a total of 12 college credits in Early Childhood.

In November, Marcos Early Childhood is partnering with student council to host *Smiles of Christmas*. Smiles is when 200 children from a Tempe Elementary school come to Marcos and are paired up with a high school student. Each pair spends the day doing various activities, coloring, arts and crafts, dancing, and doing a project from Home Depot. Santa is also there with a photo booth. It's a great community service activity for high school students who want to give back to the community. This is the first year that Marcos will host the event, and we are excited to make it memorable for the high school students as well as the elementary students.


