Although online grade reports are updated regularly, the grades reflected might already be outdated. The student's grades are subject to change at any time and is not official until reported on a district-issued report card. Student grades are posted for your convenience as a general indicator of the student's progress.

ADDRESS CHANGES

It is imperative that the school has your current address with accurate home, work, and cell phone numbers. Parents and legal guardians please inform the student services office as soon as possible if:

- you have moved. (You must provide proof of address before an address change can be made. Please fill out a new Student Data Revisions form and provide us with a copy of your new lease agreement, mortgage statement, or current electric bill.)
- there is a change in any of your phone numbers. It is important that we have current phone numbers in the computer in the event a staff member needs to contact you for any reason.
- you need to change the designated Emergency Contact in your child's records. It is important to have someone else we can contact if we are unable to reach you during the school day.

To make necessary changes to student information, please contact the Attendance Office at (480) 838-3200. Please remember that the office needs any updates pertaining to your son or daughter as they occur. Updates include change of address, phone numbers, and emergency contact information. **PLEASE NOTE:** All address changes need to be made by the parent/guardian and must be accompanied by proof of the new address.

CLASS WITHDRAWAL POLICY

Students who are dropped from any class due to excessive absences will remain in that class under no credit status. All other classes drop/adds have to be made within the first ten days of school.

ONLINE, CORRESPONDENCE AND CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT STUDENTS

All online, correspondence, and concurrent enrollment courses must have prior approval from a counselor or/and registrar if a student expects to receive high school credit. It is the student's responsibility to have an official transcript submitted to the Records Clerk upon completion of the course prior to May 15, 2018. All courses must meet Tempe Union High School District's curriculum standards. These standards include content as well as credit hours. Again, make sure to check with your counselor to ensure that the course you are wanting to take satisfies the district's graduation requirements.

TUHSD ONLINE SCHOOL TRANSFER CREDIT INFORMATION

Acceptance of online transfer credits from sources outside the Tempe Union High School District is not automatic. It is recommended that students meet with their counselor before enrolling in courses outside TUHSD to determine what process must be followed, and to clarify whether the credit will be accepted as an elective or core credit.

Online courses from non-TUHSD accredited high schools are accepted by TUHSD as elective credit only, unless a request is made for consideration as academic credit (Mathematics, English, Social Studies and Science) on a TUHSD Online School Transfer Credit Form.

Upon receipt of the provider's official transcript and notification, the student may request to take an End of Course (EOC) examination in each particular course in which core credit has been denied by submitting an Online School Transfer Credit Form within ten (10) school days. The School District shall accept the credit as a core credit for each particular course in which the student takes an examination and receives a passing score of seventy percent (70.0%) or better. In lieu of a letter grade, students will receive a "P" indicating they have passed the course. Please refer to policy JFABC, Admission of Transfer Students (Academic Credit Transfer).

The End of Course (EOC) exam may be taken **only one time**, and it is the responsibility of the student to schedule the EOC exam with the Assistant Principal of Academics. Students have **10 school days** after receiving the Online School Transfer Credit Form to schedule the exam. If the student does not show minimum competency, the online provider grade will be awarded as an elective credit. The assessment grade will be reported to the Records Specialist for transcript posting, and will retain the original form and provide a copy to the student.

Additionally, it is the responsibility of high school athletes (NCAA college-bound student-athletes) and their parents to check the ncaaclearing-house.net website to ensure that providers outside TUHSD are NCAA approved and their course offerings are accepted by NCAA.

1. Computer attendance calls will be made daily.
2. On the 11th total absence, the student will be referred to Lenica Ruiz, attendance coordinator.



ATTENDANCE POLICY

EXCUSING STUDENTS FOR APPOINTMENTS (EXCEPT FOR LUNCH TIMES)

To excuse a student for an appointment, etc., send a note with him/her to bring to the Attendance Office at the beginning of the school day. An off-campus pass will be issued to the student so that he/she may leave class at the appropriate time. By using this procedure, your son/daughter can be waiting for you in the front office. Students must **ALWAYS** check into the Attendance Office when returning to school so that the time can be noted, and the student can be admitted to class.

PLEASE NOTE: Do not access the attendance voice mailboxes to record messages for off-campus passes for students to leave school for appointments. Your message may not be heard in time for the pass to be issued.

EXCUSING NINTH AND TENTH GRADE STUDENTS AT LUNCHTIME

To enable a ninth or tenth grade student to leave the campus at lunchtime, a parent or legal guardian must personally visit the Attendance Office to complete the checkout process. A note or phone call will not be accepted. This policy is in effect due to the closure of the campus at lunchtime for ninth and tenth grade students.

EXCUSING STUDENTS FOR LATE ARRIVAL TO SCHOOL

To excuse your son or daughter for arriving late to school, you must check in with your student at the front office. A pass will be issued at that time. Your son/daughter will be sent directly to sweep if no parent/ guardian checks the student in.

ATTENDANCE RULES AND REGULATIONS

A student may lose the opportunity to earn credit when eleven total absences (excused and/or unexcused) are reached in any individual class during a semester. Unexcused absences will be recorded separately from excused absences and could result in disciplinary action.

DEFINITIONS AND GUIDELINES

SWEEP: A student will be sent to sweep during 1st or 6th hour. when he/she is late to class. All other class periods will be marked as tardy. **ABSENCE:** A student who does not attend a class or arrives 20 or more minutes late is considered absent.

EXCUSED ABSENCE: An absence is legitimate (excused) under the following conditions:

- a. Personal illness
- b. Doctor or dentist appointment
- c. Serious family illness
- d. Death in family
- e. Important family business
- f. Checking out of school through the nurse or Attendance Office
- g. Religious holiday

Students will be allowed the number of days absent to make up assignments.

In the case of long-term projects such as research papers or reports, it is the teacher's prerogative to set specific due dates. It is the student's responsibility to submit long-term projects on those specific due dates regardless if an absence is excused or unexcused. If extenuating circumstances exist, i.e. an extreme emergency or extended illness only, students will be given an extension; however, parents must notify the teacher prior to or on the due date when an emergency arises.

UNEXCUSED ABSENCE: Any absence that is not excused within 24 hours of the absence by a parent/guardian. Students will be accountable for information missed. It is recommended that no credit be given by the teacher.

SCHOOL-RELATED ABSENCE: If a student misses a class due to a pre-approved, school-related activity, it will not count as an absence.

SUSPENSION: The days of suspension, even though suspension is considered a serious consequence, do not count as absences toward the attendance policy.

SCHOOL AND SAFETY POLICIES

SWEEP BUILDS RESPONSIBILITY

The SWEEP program addresses any student who is tardy. A student who is tardy is sent to the SWEEP area, room 504. The purpose of the SWEEP program is to reinforce the importance of punctuality, responsibility, and respect. If a student enters a class after the bell rings, it is a disruption to the learning process of all of the students in the class.

- Students are not allowed to be tardy to any class.
- All students who are late for 1st or 6th hour class period throughout the day are SWEPT.
- Tardiness of more than 20 minutes is classified as an absence.
- Students with excessive time in SWEEP may have further disciplinary action taken by the administration.
- A student attending SWEEP sits quietly for the remainder of the hour he or she is SWEPT.
- The student is responsible to see the teacher of the class she or he missed in order to turn in work, learn what was covered in class, and receive homework assignments.
- Remember, it is the student's responsibility to see the teacher of the missed class by the end of that day to make up the missed work for credit.
- The support of this program by parents and students, as well as of all of the MdN staff, will help create a climate for learning at Marcos de Niza High School.

LOCK-DOWN DRILLS

When there is a situation on or near the campus that has the potential to endanger students, the school's administration will place the campus under "lock-down." Classroom and building doors are locked and all students and staff remain inside until the lock-down is lifted. Beginning with the fall semester, Marcos de Niza will initiate random lock-down drills. Similar to a fire drill, lock-down drills will not be pre-announced, but the information that it is only a drill will be available should parents call in and inquire.



MDN DELIVERY POLICY



For security and safety reasons, the office does NOT accept money, notes, floral arrangements, balloons, food or any other type of deliveries to students. No exceptions!

VISITOR INFORMATION



Visitors must check in with the front office.

You will be required to leave your photo ID upon receiving a visitor's badge to be on campus. Once you have completed your visit on campus, you will need to check out in the front office to obtain your ID and return your visitor's badge. This process is implemented so that we have an accurate record of who has been on campus and/or who is on the campus should there be an emergency situation in which people need to be accounted. Thank you in advance for your cooperation and assistance in implementing this procedure.

CLOSED CAMPUS



The MdN Site Council determined that the MdN campus would be closed for incoming freshmen and sophomores. A closed campus for freshmen and sophomores means that those students may not leave the campus during lunch unless they are signed out by a parent. Juniors and seniors are permitted to leave campus at lunch provided they first complete an application and meet the criteria to leave campus. Juniors and seniors may leave the campus during their release hour provided they can show a current schedule or release card. If you have questions about our closed campus policy, feel free to contact the principal at (480) 838-3200.

BUS SERVICE



Bus service is available to students who live outside a two mile radius of the campus and within the Marcos boundaries. It is important for students to remember that school rules not only apply while on campus but also while riding a school bus or waiting at a bus stop.

See the bus schedule for times and locations of pick-ups and drop-offs. Times will vary to accommodate special schedules. Students should arrive at the bus stop at least 15 minutes before the scheduled time. All pick-up times are approximate.

THE TEMPE YOUTH TRANSIT PASS



The Tempe Youth Transit Pass Program allows all eligible Tempe youth ages 6 to 18 to ride regional and local Valley Metro bus routes and the METRO light rail for free. Free passes are available at the Tempe Transit Store, 200 E. Fifth St., from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

If you attend Tempe, Compadre, Marcos de Niza or McClintock High Schools **AND LIVE IN TEMPE OR GUADALUPE**, you can get your transit pass at the school. Go to the activities office for more information and to get a registration form. If you attend Tempe, Compadre, Marcos de Niza or McClintock High Schools and get the pass at the school (not at the Transit Store), the parent does not need to accompany the child nor do you need to have the proof of residency or birth certificate. The school registrar will verify all the information.

- Assists in facilitating State testing throughout the year
- Assists with proctoring of AP testing
- Schedules and facilitates requested parent/teacher conferences of students
- Coordinates 504 conferences for students
- Coordinates evaluation/screenings of students
- Writes letters of recommendation and aids in the college application process of students
- Aids students with scholarship opportunities
- Aids students with career guidance
- Aids students with personal/social issues and referrals
- Facilitates homebound and chronic illness eligibility
- Coordinates and facilitates interventions for school wide crisis situations
- Documents all meetings and needed information in student conference notes in Synergy.

PSAT TESTING INFORMATION

Marcos de Niza will be administering the PSAT to ALL 9th, 10th & 11th graders on Wednesday, October 25, 2017. For a 2nd year in a row, TUHSD will be funding the PSAT costs, which means there is no need for students to register or pay for the test. The guidance department delivered PSAT Practice Booklets for all 9th, 10th & 11th graders in their 3rd hour classes earlier this month. Teachers have distributed practice booklets to our students and have ask them to utilize the information to prepare for the PSAT test, on their own time.

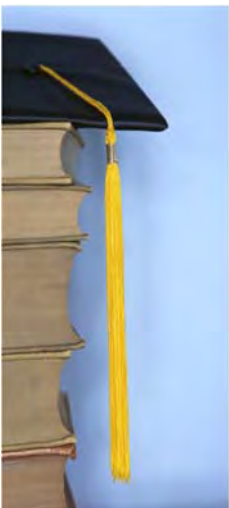

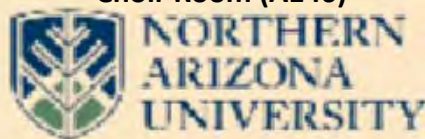

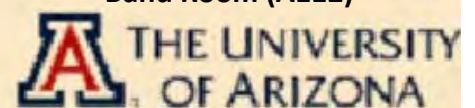
