WELCOME BACK, PADRES!

Welcome to Marcos de Niza High School and to the 2015-2016 school year! Thank you for making MdN your school of choice. My name is Mr. Carlos Alvarado and I am the assistant principal in charge of academics. My office is always of service to you, a place where we can provide assistance with schedules, transcripts, curriculum, registration and graduation information. Although we try our best to ensure that everyone graduates on time, it is ultimately each student's responsibility to ensure the successful completion of his/her final year of high school. Any issues that arise due to attendance or any discipline concerns for all seniors will be handled in this office. Please visit or call me direct at (480) 730-7634, if you have any questions or need assistance.

ADDRESS CHANGES

It is imperative that the school has your current address with accurate home, work, and cell phone numbers. Parents and legal guardians, please inform the student services office as soon as possible:

If you have moved. (You must provide proof of address before an address change can be made. Please fill out a new Student Data Revisions form and provide us with a copy of your new lease agreement, mortgage statement, or current electric bill.)

If there is a change in any of your phone numbers. It is important that we have current phone numbers in the computer in the event a staff member needs to contact you for any reason.

If you need to change the designated Emergency Contact in your child's records. It is important to have someone else we can contact if we are unable to reach you during the school day.

To make necessary changes to student information, please contact the Attendance Office at (480) 838-3200. Please remember that the office needs any updates pertaining to your son or daughter as they occur. Updates include change of address, phone numbers, and emergency contact information. **PLEASE NOTE:** All address changes need to be made by the parent/guardian and must be accompanied by proof of the new address.

ONLINE, CORRESPONDENCE AND CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT STUDENTS

All online, correspondence, and concurrent enrollment courses must have prior approval from a counselor or/and registrar if a student expects to receive high school credit. It is the student's responsibility to have an official transcript submitted to the Records Clerk upon completion of the course prior to May 14, 2016. All courses must meet Tempe Union High School District's curriculum standards. These standards include content as well as credit hours. Again, make sure to check with your counselor to ensure that the course you are wanting to take satisfies the district's graduation requirements.

2015-2016 FINAL EXAM POLICY

All final exams in May for all students including seniors will be given on the same days. There will be no early exams or release days for seniors prior to graduation.

CLASS WITHDRAWAL POLICY

Students who are dropped from a math, English, or science class due to excessive absences will remain in that class under no credit status until they pass that particular subject area on their AIMS test. All other classes drop/adds have to be made within the first ten days of school.

ONLINE GRADES

MdN teachers post their grades online. If you have access to the Internet, this may be an easy way for you and your child to keep track of day-to-day academic progress.

SENIOR CREDIT CHECKS

Senior credit checks will be completed by a counselor to determine graduation status. However, it is the responsibility of the parent and student to ensure that the student is on track for graduation and for entrance into post-secondary institutions.



FROM THE NURSE'S OFFICE

Students: When you are ill, you must report to Nurse Allen, who will contact your parent/guardian and make arrangements for your release. The nurse's office is located on the north entrance to the 200 building. The room number is 201.

Attendance...reporting an absence



REPORTING STUDENT ABSENCES THE ATTENDANCE OFFICE IS OPEN WEEKDAYS FROM 7:15 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

To report an absence, please access the voice mail system (available 24 hours) by dialing (480) 730- 7659. Only parents or legal guardians may excuse absences. In order for an absence to be excused, the parent/legal guardian must call the Attendance Office within 24 hours of the absence.

EXCUSING STUDENTS FOR APPOINTMENTS (EXCEPT FOR LUNCH TIMES)

To excuse a student for an appointment, etc., send a note with him/her to bring to the Attendance Office at the beginning of the school day. An off-campus pass will be issued to the student so that he/she may leave class at the appropriate time. By using this procedure, your son/daughter can be waiting for you in the front office. Students must **ALWAYS** check into the Attendance Office when returning to school so that the time can be noted, and the student can be admitted to class.

PLEASE NOTE: Do not access the attendance voice mailboxes to record messages for off-campus passes for students to leave school for appointments. Your message may not be heard in time for the pass to be issued.

EXCUSING NINTH AND TENTH GRADE STUDENTS AT LUNCHTIME

To enable a ninth or tenth grade student to leave the campus at lunchtime, a parent or legal guardian must personally visit the Attendance Office to complete the checkout process. A note or phone call will not be accepted. This policy is in effect due to the closure of the campus at lunchtime for ninth and tenth grade students.

EXCUSING STUDENTS FOR LATE ARRIVAL TO SCHOOL

To excuse your son or daughter for arriving late to school, you must check in with your student at the front office. A pass will be issued at that time. Your son/daughter will be sent directly to sweep if no parent/guardian checks the student in.

ATTENDANCE RULES AND REGULATIONS

A student may lose the opportunity to earn credit when sixteen total absences (excused and/or unexcused) are reached in any individual class during a semester. Unexcused absences will be recorded separately from excused absences and could result in disciplinary action.

DEFINITIONS AND GUIDELINES

SWEEP: A student will be sent to sweep when he/she is late to class.

ABSENCE: A student who does not attend a class or arrives 20 or more minutes late is considered absent.

EXCUSED ABSENCE: An absence is legitimate (excused) under the following conditions:

- a. Personal illness
- b. Doctor or dentist appointment
- c. Serious family illness
- d. Death in family
- e. Important family business
- f. Checking out of school through the Nurse or Attendance Office
- g. Religious holiday

Students will be allowed the number of days absent to make up assignments.

In the case of long-term projects such as research papers or reports, it is the teacher's prerogative to set specific due dates. It is the student's responsibility to submit long-term projects on those specific due dates regardless if an absence is excused or unexcused. If extenuating circumstances exist, i.e. an extreme emergency or extended illness only, students will be given an extension; however, parents must notify the teacher prior to or on the due date when an emergency arises.

UNEXCUSED ABSENCE: Any absence that is not excused within 24 hours of the absence by a parent/guardian. Students will be accountable for information missed. It is recommended that no credit be given by the teacher.

SCHOOL-RELATED ABSENCE: If a student misses a class due to a pre-approved, school-related activity, it will not count as an absence.

SUSPENSION: The days of suspension, even though suspension is considered a serious consequence, do not count as absences toward the attendance policy.

ATTENDANCE PROCEDURE:

1. Computer attendance calls will be made daily.
2. On the 16th total absence, the student will be referred to Jermaine Whitaker, attendance coordinator.

MARCOS DE NIZA HIGH SCHOOL DROPOUT PREVENTION PROCEDURES

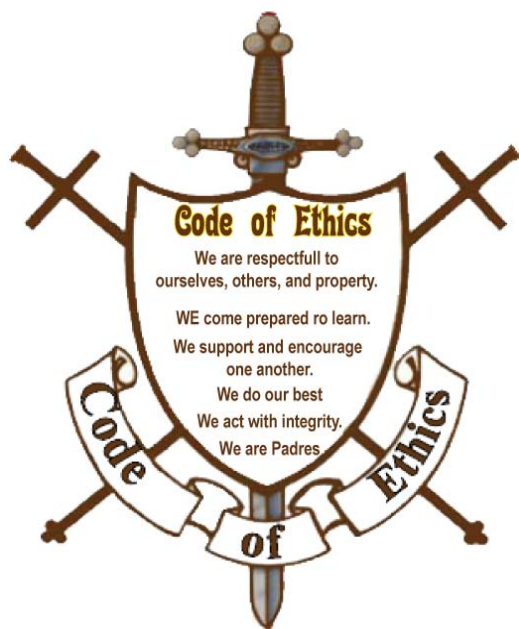
3rd absence: Dropout Coordinator will meet with the student informing the students of the number of absences and reviewing the MDN attendance policy. Dropout Coordinator will document this contact in Synergy (student conference notes). Morning, lunch or after school detention may be assigned.

5th absence: Dropout Prevention Coordinator will meet with the student and contact parents/guardian via phone call or email explaining that the student has reached 5 absences in one or more classes and that if this continues it could negatively impact the student's grade. One day of after school detention may be assigned to make up class time and complete missed assignments; regular school day attendance is still required.

8th absence: Dropout Prevention Coordinator meets with the student to sign an Excessive Absence/Loss of Credit Acknowledgement form. Student takes form to his/her teacher and home to parents/guardian for signature and returns it to Dropout Prevention Coordinator. Three days of after school detention may be assigned to make up class time and missed assignments; regular school day attendance is still required.

11th absence: Student's attendance record will now go into a review to determine if the extenuating circumstances will allow the student to continue with the class and earn credit beyond the 16th absence. If there are none, student will lose credit at 16th absences but will remain in the class unless he/she becomes a disruption to the educational process. Five days of after school detention may be assigned to make up class time and complete missed assignment; regular school day attendance is still required.

16th absence: Student will lose credit for the class unless they have an approved extenuating circumstances or a current Chronic Illness Plan on file with the school. Students with 504 plans, special needs, and chronic illness forms will follow a process that is appropriate for their circumstances. Contact Dropout Prevention Coordinator for more information as needed.



VISITOR INFORMATION



Our visitor process is as follows: When you check in with the front office, you will be required to leave your photo ID upon receiving a visitors badge to be on campus. Once you have completed your visit on campus, you will need to check out in the front office to obtain your ID and return your visitor badge. This process will be implemented so that we have an accurate record of who has been on campus and/or who is on the campus should there be an emergency situation in which people need to be accounted. Thank you in advance for your cooperation and assistance in implementing this new procedure.

CLOSED CAMPUS

The MdN Site Council determined that the MdN campus would be closed for incoming freshman and sophomores. A closed campus for freshman and sophomores means that those students may not leave the campus during lunch unless they are signed out by a parent. Juniors and seniors are permitted to leave campus at lunch provided they can show a current, legitimate student ID card identifying their year. Likewise, juniors and seniors may leave the campus during their release hour provided they can show a current schedule or release card. If you have questions about our closed campus policy, feel free to contact the principal at (480)838-3200.



LOCK-DOWN DRILLS

When there is a situation on or near the campus that has the potential to endanger students, the school's administration will place the campus under "lock-down." Classroom and building doors are locked and all students and staff remain inside until the lock-down is lifted. Beginning with the fall semester, Marcos de Niza will initiate random lock-down drills. Similar to a fire drill, lock-down drills will not be pre-announced, but the information that it is only a drill will be available should parents call in and inquire.



BUS SERVICE

Bus service is available to students who live outside a two mile radius of the campus and within the Marcos boundaries. It is important for students to remember that school rules not only apply while on campus but also while riding a school bus or waiting at a bus stop. See the bus schedule for times and locations of pick up and drop off. Times will vary to accommodate special schedules. Students should arrive at the bus stop at least 15 minutes before the scheduled time. All pick up times are approximate. Students must show a valid ID to board the bus.



SWEEP BUILDS RESPONSIBILITY



The SWEEP program addresses any student who is tardy. A student who is tardy is sent to the SWEEP area, room 504. The purpose of the SWEEP program is to reinforce the importance of punctuality, responsibility, and respect. If a student enters a class after the bell rings, it is a disruption to the learning process of all of the students in the class.

- Students are not allowed to be tardy to any class.
- All students who are late for any class period throughout the day are SWEPT.
- Tardiness of more than 10 minutes is classified as an absence.
- Every third SWEEP will count as an unexcused absence.
- Students with excessive time in SWEEP may have further disciplinary action taken by the administration.
- A student attending SWEEP sits quietly for the remainder of the hour he or she is SWEPT.
- The student is responsible to see the teacher of the class she or he missed in order to turn in work, learn what was covered in class, and receive homework assignments.
- Remember, it is the student's responsibility to see the teacher of the missed class by the end of that day to make up the missed work for credit.
- The support of this program by parents and students, as well as of all of the MdN staff, will help create a climate for learning at Marcos de Niza High School.

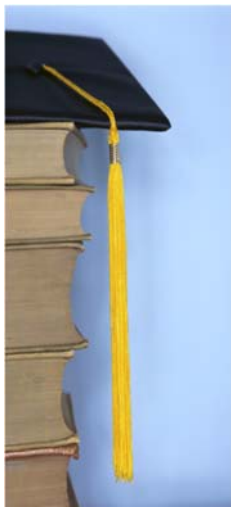

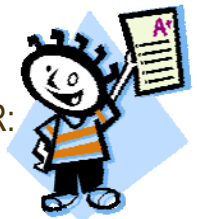

MDN NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY SELECTION PROCEDURES

New members are selected each fall for the Marcos de Niza chapter of the National Honor Society. The selection process begins in September when the staff is asked to nominate the most qualified students from a list of those who have met the minimum academic eligibility of **either a 3.5 grade point average or 84 official rank honor points for juniors and a 3.5 grade point average or 126 official rank honor points for seniors.** Faculty nomination is based on a student's demonstration of outstanding *character, leadership, and service, as well as scholarship.*

Students who receive the necessary number of faculty votes are then invited to apply for membership with written documentation of their service and achievements to support their candidacy and continue in the selection process. Students' names are removed from these documents, and a faculty committee of five teachers reviews them in a "blind" reading and voting process. There is no quota for the number of new members who may be selected, but the committee's standards are rigorous.

Those students who are the final choices of the committee are notified in early November of their selection and are invited to become NHS members at a formal induction ceremony in late November.

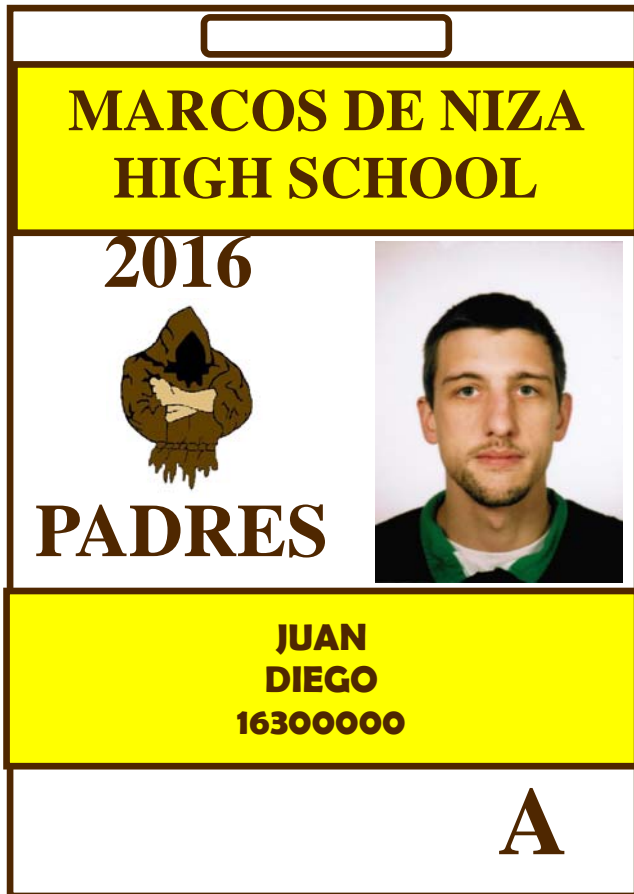
