WELCOME BACK, PADRES!

Welcome to Marcos de Niza High School and to the 2014-2015 school year! Thank you for making MdN your school of choice. My name is Mr. Carlos Alvarado and I am the assistant principal in charge of registration. My office is always of service to you, a place where you can receive assistance with student's schedules, transcripts, curriculum, registration and graduation information. Although we try our best to make sure everyone graduates on time, it is ultimately each student's responsibility to ensure the successful completion of his/her final year of high school. Any issues that arise due to attendance or any discipline concerns for all seniors will be handled in this office. Please visit or call me direct at (480) 730-7634, if you have any questions or need assistance.

ADDRESS CHANGES

It is imperative that the school has your current address with accurate home, work, and cell phone numbers. Parents and legal guardians please inform the student services office as soon as possible if:

■ you have moved. (You must provide proof of address before an address change can be made. Please fill out a new Student Data Revisions form and provide us with a copy of your new lease agreement, mortgage statement, or current electric bill.)

there is a change in any of your phone numbers. It is important that we have current phone numbers in the computer in the event a staff member needs to contact you for any reason.

■ you need to change the designated Emergency Contact in your child's records. It is important to have someone else we can contact if we are unable to reach you during the school day.

To make necessary changes to student information, please contact the Attendance Office at (480) 838-3200. Please remember that the office needs any updates pertaining to your son or daughter as they occur. Updates include change of address, phone numbers, and emergency contact information. **PLEASE NOTE:** All address changes need to be made by the parent/guardian and must be accompanied by proof of the new address.

ONLINE, CORRESPONDENCE AND CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT STUDENTS

All online, correspondence, and concurrent enrollment courses must have prior approval from a counselor or/and registrar if a student expects to receive high school credit. It is the student's responsibility to have an official transcript submitted to the Records Clerk upon completion of the course prior to May 15, 2015. All courses must meet Tempe Union High School District's curriculum standards. These standards include content as well as credit hours. Again, make sure to check with your counselor to ensure that the course you are wanting to take satisfies the district's graduation requirements.

2014-2015 FINAL EXAM POLICY

All final exams in May for all students including seniors will be given on the same days. There will be no early exams or release days for seniors prior to graduation.

CLASS WITHDRAWAL POLICY

Students who are dropped from a math, English, or science class due to excessive absences will remain in that class under no credit status until they pass that particular subject area on their AIMS test. All other classes drop/adds have to be made within the first ten days of school.

Attendance...reporting an absence



REPORTING STUDENT ABSENCES THE ATTENDANCE OFFICE IS OPEN WEEKDAYS FROM 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

To report an absence, please access the voice mail system (available 24 hours) using the numbers listed in the box below. Only parents or legal guardians may excuse absences. In order for an absence to be excused, the parent/legal guardian must call the Attendance Office within 24 hours of the absence.

EXCUSING STUDENTS FOR APPOINTMENTS (EXCEPT FOR LUNCH TIMES)

To excuse a student for an appointment, etc., send a note with him/her to bring to the Attendance Office at the beginning of the school day. An off-campus pass will be issued to the student so that he/she may leave class at the appropriate time. By using this procedure, your son/ daughter can be waiting for you in the front office. Students must **AL-WAYS** check into the Attendance Office when returning to school so that the time can be noted, and the student can be admitted to class.

PLEASE NOTE: Do not access the attendance voice mailboxes to record messages for off-campus passes for students to leave school for appointments. Your message may not be heard in time for the pass to be issued.

EXCUSING NINTH AND TENTH GRADE STUDENTS AT LUNCHTIME

To enable a ninth or tenth grade student to leave the campus at lunchtime, a parent or legal guardian must personally visit the Attendance Office to complete the checkout process. A note or phone call will not be accepted. This policy is in effect due to the closure of the campus at lunchtime for ninth and tenth grade students.

EXCUSING STUDENTS FOR LATE ARRIVAL TO SCHOOL

To excuse your son or daughter for arriving late to school, you must check in with your student at the front office. A pass will be issued at that time. Your son/daughter will be sent directly to sweep if no parent/ guardian checks the student in.

ATTENDANCE RULES AND REGULATIONS

A student may lose the opportunity to earn credit when eleven total absences (excused and/or unexcused) are reached in any individual class during a semester. Unexcused absences will be recorded separately from excused absences and could result in disciplinary action.

DEFINITIONS AND GUIDELINES

SWEEP: A student will be sent to sweep when he/she is late to class.

ABSENCE: A student who does not attend a class or arrives 20 or more minutes late is considered absent.

EXCUSED ABSENCE: An absence is legitimate (excused) under the following conditions:

- a. Personal illness
- b. Doctor or dentist appointment
- c. Serious family illness
- d. Death in family
- e. Important family business
- f. Checking out of school through the Nurse or Attendance Office
- g. Religious holiday

Students will be allowed the number of days absent to make up assignments.

In the case of long-term projects such as research papers or reports, it is the teacher's prerogative to set specific due dates. It is the student's responsibility to submit long-term projects on those specific due dates regardless if an absence is excused or unexcused. If extenuating circumstances exist, i.e. an extreme emergency or extended illness only, students will be given an extension; however, parents must notify the teacher prior to or on the due date when an emergency arises.

UNEXCUSED ABSENCE: Any absence that is not excused within 24 hours of the absence by a parent/guardian. Students will be accountable for information missed. It is recommended that no credit be given by the teacher.

SCHOOL-RELATED ABSENCE: If a student misses a class due to a pre-approved, school-related activity, it will not count as an absence.

SUSPENSION: The days of suspension, even though suspension is considered a serious consequence, do not count as absences toward the attendance policy.

ATTENDANCE PROCEDURE:

- 1. Computer attendance calls will be made daily.
- 2. On the 11th total absence, the student will be referred to Jermaine Whitaker, attendance coordinator.



LOCK-DOWN DRILLS

When there is a situation on or near the campus that has the potential to endanger students, the school's administration will place the campus under "lock-down." Classroom and building doors are locked and all students and staff remain inside until the lock-down is lifted. Beginning

with the fall semester, Marcos de Niza will initiate random lock-down drills. Similar to a fire drill, lock-down drills will not be pre-announced, but the information that it is only a drill will be available should parents call in and inquire.

VISITOR INFORMATION



This year there will be a change to our visitor process. When you check in with the front office you will be required to leave your photo ID upon receiving a visitors badge to be on campus. Once you have completed your visit on campus, you will need to check out in the front office to obtain your ID and return your visitor

badge. This process will be implemented so that we have an accurate record of who has been on campus and/or who is on the campus should there be an emergency situation in which people need to be accounted. Thank you in advance for your cooperation and assistance in implementing this new procedure.

CLOSED CAMPUS



The MdN Site Council determined that the MdN campus would be closed for incoming freshman and sophomores. A closed campus for freshman and sophomores means that those students may not leave the campus during lunch unless they are signed out by a parent. Juniors and seniors are permitted to leave campus at lunch provided they can show a current, legitimate student ID card identifying their year. Juniors and seniors may leave the campus during their release hour provid-

ed they can show a current schedule or release card. If you have guestions about our closed campus policy, feel free to contact the principal at (480)838-3200.

RECOGNITION AND INCENTIVE PROGRAMS

The Padres of the Month Program is designed to recognize outstanding Marcos teachers, staff and students. Students are nominated on the basis of any of the following: integrity, honesty, scholastic endeavors, service to school, good behavior, citizenship or courage. Teachers and staff members can be nominated based on academic contributions, school activities, community involvement, or care and concern for students. Eight students, two athletes, two teachers and one staff member are selected each month to receive Padre of the Month honors. The honorees receive a group photo, a certificate, free admission to a school event, and lunch with the principal. 
The Padre Renaissance Program at Marcos de Niza High School recognizes outstanding students for good academic achievement and good citizenship by giving rewards such as gift cards, movie tickets, coupons and merchandise. Students will be recognized after 1st quarter and 3rd guarter. During each of those periods, students chosen must have achieved a 3.5 or higher GPA and/or a nomination as a Padre of the Month. They also must not have received any discipline referrals for that quarter. These students are eligible to win a variety of prizes and their names will be listed on the Marcos website under the "Awards" heading.

BUS SERVICE

Bus service is available to students who live outside a two mile radius of the campus and within the Marcos boundaries. It is important for students to remember that school rules not only apply while on campus but also while riding a school bus or waiting at a bus stop.



See the bus schedule for times and locations of pick up and drop off. Times will vary to accommodate special schedules. Students should arrive at the bus stop at least 15 minutes before the scheduled time. All pick up times are approximate.

SWEEP BUILDS RESPONSIBILITY

The SWEEP program addresses any student who is tardy. A student who is tardy is sent to the SWEEP area, room 504. The purpose of the SWEEP program is to reinforce the importance of punctuality, responsibility, and respect. If a student enters a class after the bell rings, it is a disruption to the learning process of all of the students in the class.

- Students are not allowed to be tardy to any class.
- All students who are late for any class period throughout the day are SWEPT.
- Tardiness of more than 10 minutes is classified as an absence.
- Every third SWEEP will count as an unexcused absence.
- Students with excessive time in SWEEP may have further disciplinary action taken by the administration.
- A student attending SWEEP sits quietly for the remainder of the hour he or she is SWEPT.
- The student is responsible to see the teacher of the class she or he missed in order to turn in work, learn what was covered in class, and receive homework assignments.
- Remember, it is the student's responsibility to see the teacher of the missed class by the end of that day to make up the missed work for credit.
- The support of this program by parents and students, as well as of all of the MdN staff, will help create a climate for learning at Marcos de Niza High School.

It's the beginning of a new school year and Marcos is on the move!. Students are joining clubs, doing fundraisers, volunteering in the community and best of all, working hard. It is important that everyone participates and gains some Padre Pride.

As the year continues, keep in mind some of

the programs available to your child. The following can be of help for all students:

Academic Opportunity: Marcos adopted a policy last year that said, "Failure is not an Option." Teachers assign students who have 0's in their class/classes to our Homework Lab from 3:00-4:00 p.m. It is exactly what it sounds like, an opportunity for students to make up their work. It is not a punitive measure. They do not receive full credit for these late assignments, but academic credit is given. The goal: Raise your grade, participate in class and increase your subject knowledge.

Homework Lab: This takes place every Monday, Tuesday and Thursday in the LRTC (library). Students will have the advantage of working with certified teachers from our campus from 3:00-4:00 p.m. They can use the computers or work with other students, but the key here is to complete classwork and homework. We also have a lab in room 133 set up for all Guadalupe and Indian Education students. If you have any questions regarding this lab, please contact Ray Delgado at ext. 40072 or Staci Mendoza at ext. 40068.

Conference Period: This takes place every day. Any student can go to his/her teacher's class and get the help they need. All teachers are available at 7:30 a.m. to assist their students. Conference period is a good way for students to get their missing work if they were absent or if, by chance, they were sent to sweep.

Athletic Conference: This program was developed by our athletic department to create accountability for academics far beyond the district requirements. Student–athletes with **D's and F's** are assigned to Athletic Conference. This takes place from 7:30-7:55 a.m. every Tuesday—Thursday. When athletes raise their grades, they are released from Athletic Conference. When they fail to attend, they are disciplined, which could include no participation that week in their sport.

DUAL ENROLLMENT CLASSES WITH RIO SALADO COLLEGE

We are thrilled to be continuing another year of dual enrollment in our partnership with Rio Salado College. Rio Salado Dual Enrollment is the only **NACEP** (National Alliance of Concurrent Enrollment Partnerships) accredited college in Arizona. Currently, we offer the following courses for dual enrollment credit through Rio: ceramics, computer applications, desktop publishing, multimedia technology, advanced marketing, ap art history, early childhood 1/2 and 3/4, ap computer science, java programming, advanced composition (ENG101/102), ap senior literature and composition, honors junior English, honors US History, AP US History, pre calculus, ap statistics, honors brief calculus/finite math, calculus, Spanish 5/6 and Spanish 7/8. For the 2014-2015 school year, we may be adding more, so check <u>www.riosalado.edu/dual</u> for more information about current courses.

The cost for classes for Maricopa county residents is 84.00/credit hour plus a \$15.00 fee for registration each semester.

Tuition Assistance for 2014-2015 School Year: Rio Salado College continues to offer tuition assistance to eligible students based on financial need. Students who wish to participate for fall of 2015 must apply for Tuition Assistance in spring of 2015 to receive funding. Dates will be posted on our website and will be announced throughout campus.

Dual Enrollment courses will transfer to all in-state universities and community colleges and many out-of-state universities to include: Purdue, University of Arkansas, University of Massachusetts, University of Nebraska, University of Wisconsin, and the University of Washington, just to name a few. ATTENTION JUNIORS! Do you want to EXCEED on AIMS?

If you are planning to get an Honors Tuition Waiver to an Arizona state university by EXCEEDING on AIMS, you must sign up to take the test in the Counseling Department. You must sign up prior to September 30th for the test due to ordering deadlines.

Remember:: To get the waiver, you must have

- B or better in each core course (as defined by the Arizona Board of Regents Tri-University Admission requirements)
- GPA of 3.5 or be in the top 5%
- Exceeded the Standards on all THREE of the AIMS (Math, Reading, and Writing) tests* or Exceeded the Standards on TWO of the AIMS tests and Meet the Standards on one of the AIMS tests* and received at least a score of 3 on two Advanced Placement tests or have a score of at least 4 on two International Baccalaureate exams.
- At least a 28 on the ACT test or at least a 1300 on the SAT1 test

*Only AIMS results from a student's sophomore and junior year will be considered when determining eligibility for the High Honors Tuition Waiver. This means that students will need to "Exceed" on AIMS during their sophomore or junior year to qualify.

A.I.M.S. TESTING Pass the test!

In order to be 2015 graduates, students **must pass** Arizona's Instrument to Measure Standards, the state-mandated reading, writing and math tests entitled *AIMS*. There are exceptions to the AIMS graduation re-quirement for students transferring to Arizona from out-of-state. Students or parents must provide official documentation to the school of the child's score(s) from the other state. High school counselors and registrars have a list available of specific exams and states that are eligible for Arizona reciprocity. The State Board of Education has approved the following subtest scores from the SAT and ACT for the purposes of satisfying the AIMS high school graduation requirements

AIMS High School Content Area	Reciprocal SAT Test Scores	Reciprocal ACT Test Scores
Writing	420 or higher on Writing	16 or higher on combined English/writing
Reading	420 or higher on critical reading	16 or higher on reading
Mathematics	420 or higher on mathematics	16 or higher on mathematics

To be eligible for College Entrance Exam Reciprocity, students must have tested on the applicable content area(s) of AIMS HS at each testing opportunity for which the student was eligible to test. Testing opportunities, or test administrations, begin with the spring semester of the student's second year of high school and continue every fall and spring semester through the student's final semester of high school.

Notices are sent during the summer after the spring test and in January after the Fall test to the students who took AIMS advising them of their test scores: Exceeds (4), Meets (3), Approaches (2), and Falls Far Below (1). Junior and senior students with test scores of **A** (Approaches) and **F** (Falls Far Below) must test again; students with a score of **M** (Meets) may sign up to Exceed.

HELPING STUDENTS TO MEET THE STANDARD

Juniors and seniors who have not met the standard for AIMS have an abundance of assistance in preparation to take the upcoming AIMS tests. Marcos teachers continue to incorporate reading, writing, math and test taking strategies across the curriculum in order to prepare students. Junior and senior students who have not met the standards were able to register for an elective credit math lab and an elective credit reading class specifically designed to assist students with AIMS. If a student was unable to fit one or both of these classes in their schedule, they have the opportunity for after school tutoring in our homework lab.

Spring 2014 *AIMS* scores (combined with previous year's scores) reflect a high percentage of MdN juniors and seniors exceeding or meeting the standards and many more are within just a few points of passing. Over two hundred and forty juniors and seniors have exceeded the standards in one or more areas.

The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/ NMSQT) is a program cosponsored by the College Board and <u>National</u> <u>Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC)</u>. It's a standardized test that provides firsthand practice for the SAT[®]. It also gives you a chance to enter NMSC scholarship programs and gain access to college and career planning tools. You can register for the PSAT, starting September 29, at the MdN Bookstore. The cost is \$25. There are only so many slots, so make sure you register once registration opens up.

The PSAT/NMSQT measures:

- Critical reading skills
- Math problem-solving skills
- Writing skills

You have developed these skills over many years, both in and out of school. This test doesn't require you to recall specific facts from your classes.

The most common reasons for taking the PSAT/NMSQT are to:

- Receive feedback on your strengths and weaknesses on skills necessary for college study. You can then focus your preparation on those areas that could most benefit from additional study or
- See how your performance on an admissions test might compare with that of others applying to college.
- Enter the competition for scholarships from NMSC (grade 11)
- Help prepare for the SAT. You can become familiar with the kinds of questions and the exact directions you will see on the SAT. Receive information from colleges when you check "yes" to Student Search Service. *Information from collegeboard.com*

A QUESTION, VISIT YOUR LIBRARY DURING TEEN READ WEEK 2014

Students will be reading and answering questions for the fun of it as Marcos de Niza's Library (LRTC) celebrates Teen Read Week, October 12th-18th, 2014. They join thousands of other libraries, schools, and bookstores across the country who are encouraging teens to celebrate reading. While the national theme is **Turn Dreams into Reality**, to spotlight all the great resources and activities we provide to inspire teens to succeed in school and beyond, we went with the **A Question,** to spotlight our new LRTC website, which is providing new database resources and eBooks to help students succeed in information literacy both at the high school level and beyond. As always, we love to promote the importance of pleasure reading in all its forms, but we also understand that students must learn research skills as a part of the 21st Century life skills.

Did you know that 77.7% of teens say they read at least one extra book per month for personal pleasure that isn't required for school reading and 24.5% read five or more books per month outside of school? (StageofLife.com, "Teen Trend Report on Students and Books").

How are your teen's reading habits compared to the national average?

As the MdN librarian, I know that today's teens seem to have less and less free time wih increasingly more activities for them. However, in another study "Moments of Awesomeness," hundreds of teens reported that their number one greatest moments of joy was *reading and writing* (StageofLife.com, "Statistics about Teens and Where They Find Joy"). This is why it's still so important to encourage teens to set aside some time to read and write. Literacy is a topic of both local and national concern, especially with the change to the common core standards, which supports more non-fiction reading and more critical writing skills.

Studies show that a regular reading habit increases reading proficiency, and this librarian agrees. More importantly, regular reading habits help in scoring better on high-stake tests. Of the ways in which teens read books, an actual paper book was 98%, followed by an eReader at 29.4%, online at 16.4% and mobile phone at 13.5% (StageofLife.com, "Teen Trend Report on Students and Books"). As technology is changing the way we read, Marcos de Niza has moved to purchasing more eBooks and online reference materials so that students may read 24/7. Students may read our eBooks online or download the Follett Brytewave app on an e-reader/mobile device. The directions and remote accesses for these resources are provided on a bookmark at the LRTC for student use. (Sorry, the remote access information cannot be posted to publicly accessible websites, but all members of the MDN school community are welcome and encouraged to use the resources.) Moreover, I still strive to purchase the latest hot-off-the-press teen reads for students to check out. Some of us still like to hold a physical book in our hands! However one likes to read, we are providing a format to encourage "moments of awesomeness".

Parents of teen are encouraged to celebrate Teen Read Week at home by checking out a book from our school or public library, setting aside time each night for the family to read, joining a book discussion group at school or public library, and even sharing a favorite book with your teen. Don't forget! When you We'll find the answers together.
