Hello Pride Families,

Can you believe we are already well into the month of November? It seems like each year time goes a little faster. Our students and staff have had a great 1st quarter. The 'Tukee Bowl and Homecoming were huge successes this year. All of the students and staff involved in those two events are to be commended. Both events went off without a hitch. We inducted three new members of the Pride family into our Hall of Fame; Sam Ballard (former head basketball coach), Rachel Melvin (actress), and Cameron Edens (golfer).

Many of our students have represented the Pride family in various competitions. The Mountain Pointe Mountain Bike Club has been competing at state wide competitions and placing in the top 15 out of more than 70 schools. Kristen Kollus has placed in the top 5 in various varsity competitions. The MP Girls Cross Country team took home 1st Place in the Varsity section of the Doug Conley Cross Country Invitational on September. 26th. Olivia Grieve, Jessie Perry and Caetlin Asher all placed in the top 12, helping to bring home the trophy. Both the Boys and Girls Cross Country teams represented well at the State Meet on November 7th. Delano Salgado was recognized by the National Alliance of African American Athletes for his achievements both on and off the football field.

The Lionhearts Marching Band participated in the NAU Band Day Festival in Flagstaff, earning "silver" award in the Festival Class Division. This is the highest placement a band in our division has received thus far in the ABODA festival season. The Lionhearts lead their division at this point in the season. The Arizona Cardinals have recognized two of our varsity football players this season as their Players of the Week; running back Macarius Blount won the award in week 4 and kicker Brandon Johnson won in week 7. The Pride football team had an amazing season remaining undefeated up to the State Semifinals. The cheer team has qualified and will be attending the USA Nationals this upcoming March in Anaheim, California. Congratulations to all students involved in extra-curricular activities and athletics. You all have represented well.

I want to remind all of our parents of the support programs we offer all of our students. We recognized that high school can be challenging at times as we strive to provide a rigorous and relevant academic experience. All students need a little help at times. Caught in the Act

Students **caught in the act of showing pride** at Mountain Pointe may be **rewarded** with a "Front of the Lunch Line" pass. There will only be approximately 30 passes in circulation at any given time and the staff who has them to give out will change weekly.

Rules for Students:

- Student recipients may only use a pass once and will turn the pass in at the time of use to the line monitor
- Students can only use the pass within the first 10 minutes of lunch
- · Student recipients must be wearing their MP ID at time of use
- · The passes may only be used at the two interior lunch lines
- · Students will need to look for the signs indicating where to go
- · Lost or damaged passes will not be reissued
- Students can choose to give their pass away but not in exchange for anything in return.


