



The Tempe Union Innovation Center is composed of six dedicated and diverse individuals, five Learning-Facilitators, and myself, the Executive Director. We are thrilled to design and implement this project-based high school program.

Operating within TUHSD, our team connects students with local government agencies, businesses, colleges, and nonprofits to work on authentic, real-world, and community-based projects. Students will earn up to three credit hours, including honors and or dual/credit, if they so choose, in English, Social Studies, Business and Science, as they work on these projects with our partners.

All learning at the Innovation Center is collaborative, student-centered, and student-driven. Within project teams, our students learn their subjects together, working cohesively, to share their expertise and problem-solving ideas generated by community partners.

### **Credits Earned Outside of TUHSD**

All credits earned outside of Tempe Union High School District require counselor approval **PRIOR** to enrollment in the non-TUHSD institution (i.e. Primavera, Pinnacle, MCC, etc.). Questions? Please contact your student's counselor.

Is your student behind on credits? MPHS offers credit recovery classes after school until 4:15 p.m. Classes are free and there is a late bus available on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Have your student see their assigned counselor to sign up.

### Stay Hydrated ~ Water Bottle Refill Stations Available On Campus

Multiple water stations are available around MPHS for use in refilling water bottles. Students are allowed to bring water bottles into our carpeted classrooms where fountain drinks, sports drinks, coffee and other nonwater beverages are NOT allowed. The stations allow the Pride campus to be more environmentally friendly while helping to keep up the appearances of our classrooms. The refill stations can be found in the main office and various other locations on both floors throughout the campus.





The above traffic flow takes effect before school and after school only on all school days.

### Pick-up and Drop-off: FRONT LOT ONLY (off of Knox Road).

- Enter from Knox Rd. at the western-most driveway.
- Proceed, following signs to drop student **in front of the school,** between Auditorium & Small Gym
- Exit the east driveway, by the marquee.

### No Parking on Red Curb (Fire Lane) Use Visitor Parking if entering the building

The purpose of red curbs is to allow emergency vehicles quick and close access in the event of an emergency. Parking along the red curb at any time is a violation of F.C. 902.2 and carries a **fine** of up to **\$40**.

- Back parking lot (off 44th Street) The back lot is for buses and staff ONLY.

## **Campus Dress Standards**

The dress standards of Mountain Pointe High School have been established to promote respect, positivity, and pride for one's self and the academic environment. **Students are encouraged to express themselves within the set of standards listed below:** 

### **Prohibited Attire / Accessories:**

- ✓ Attire or accessories which advertise, display, and/or promote any of the following **are prohibited**:
  - drugs, alcohol, tobacco
  - sexual activity
  - violence, weapons, gang activity
  - disrespect and/or bigotry towards any group or person.
- ✓ Attire or accessories which present risk to the health, safety, and general welfare of the school community **are prohibited**, including, but not limited to:
  - items which express obscenities or,
  - those that immodestly expose the chest, abdomen, legs, or buttocks.
- ✓ **Sleepwear is prohibited**, including, but not limited to, house shoes, slippers, pajamas, housecoats, and bathrobes (except on school sanctioned spirit days).

### **Prohibited Head Coverings:**

Students wearing **hooded sweatshirts are prohibited from covering their heads** with hoods inside campus buildings.

### Acceptable Head Coverings:

Hats and/or religious head-coverings are **acceptable**.

### Standard Guidelines:

- Clothing worn on the upper body must at least possess straps placed over the shoulders (no tube tops or strapless dresses).
- Undergarments must remain underneath clothing and non-visible.

### **Attendance Pointes**

Mountain Pointe is a CLOSED campus. Students may not leave campus during school hours without a parent/guardian contacting the front office.

If you call 30+ minutes ahead of the student's departure time, your wait time on campus is drastically reduced.

### Sick Student?

If a student is not feeling well, they should report to the Nurse's office. If the student needs to be sent home, the Nurse will notify a parent/guardian. Students should not call and arrange to be picked up from school by their parent/ guardian without seeing the nurse.

### **Report an Absence**

- Enter ext. 50689
  - then select:
  - 2 to report an absence for grades 9 or 10
  - 3 to report an absence for grades 11 or 12

- Reason for the absence
- Your name and relationship to the student
- Date of absence
- Periods missed
- · Phone number where you can be reached

### Late to School?

When a student is dropped off late for school, a parent/guardian must sign the student in at the front office (please use visitor parking in the front lot - do not park along the curb).

If the student is late due to a doctor's appointment, s/he can show a doctor's note in lieu of a parent/guardian signature.



Mountain Pointe is dedicated to helping your student be successful here and we hope we can work together to help them reach their goals. Please remember that when your student is absent, a parent or guardian must call them out or go through the ParentVue to excuse the absence. This MUST be done within a 24 hour period from when the student is absent. If a student has 11 absences (excused or unverified) they could lose credit for their classes. If a student reaches 16 absences in a semester, the student will not receive credit per district policy and will have to make arrangements to repeat the semester to earn credit.
