



Student Dress Code

MOUNTAIN POINTE HIGH SCHOOL

TUHSD Policy JICA and JIC-R

Students must wear appropriate clothing including:

- a top and a bottom (such as pants, shorts, skirt or the equivalent) or,
- a one-piece outfit (such as a dress or jumpsuit), and
- footwear, as required by State law

Clothing may not promote:

- drugs/alcohol/tobacco
- obscene language or symbols
- symbols of drugs
- sex, pornography
- criminal activity
- unlawful use of weapons
- advocating of violence or hate speech
- Clothing fabric must cover all private body parts
- The torso (i.e. stomach, back, chest) undergarments and must not be see-through
- Undergarment waistbands and/or straps that are incidentally visible under clothing are permitted; however, undergarments may not be worn as clothing
- Clothing may not cover a student's face to the extent that the student is not identifiable (except clothing worn for health and safety, medical, or religious purposes)

Clothing, accessories and/or jewelry may not state, imply, or depict hate speech/imagery targeting groups based on

- race
- symbols of sex
- pornography
- gender identity
- gender expression
- sexual orientation
- ethnicity
- religion
- cultural observance
- household income
- body/type size

Clothing, accessories and/or jewelry may not be:

- of images, symbols, slogans, word or phrases that are profane, discriminatory or defamatory
- worn with the intent to convey affiliation with a criminal street gang as defined in A.R.S. 13-105 and promote violence or acts of terror.



Traffic Flow for Student Pick up & Drop off

All student **drop-off & pick-up MUST** be made in the **FRONT LOT ONLY** (off of Knox Road).



The above traffic flow takes effect before school and after school only on all school days.

Pick-up and Drop-off: FRONT LOT ONLY (off of Knox Road).

- Enter from Knox Rd. at the western-most driveway.
- Proceed, following signs to drop student **in front of the school,** between Auditorium & Small Gym
- Exit the east driveway, by the marquee.

No Parking on Red Curb (Fire Lane) Use Visitor Parking if entering the building

The purpose of red curbs is to allow emergency vehicles quick and close access in the event of an emergency. Parking along the red curb at any time is a violation of F.C. 902.2 and carries a **fine** of up to **\$40**.

DO NOT Drop-off or Pick-up

in the following areas:

- On Knox Road
- On 44th Street
- Cul-de-sac (Knox & 44th Street)
- Back parking lot (off 44th Street) The back lot is for buses and staff ONLY.
- Apartment Complex
- Senior Living Center

You can be cited by the Phoenix Police for stopping in the areas listed above.

Bus Transportation for Students

School ID Required to Board Bus-

Students MUST show their CURRENT (2023-2024) MP student ID in order to board a school bus. Any student not showing their school ID after the first week of school will not be allowed to board the bus. (IDs will be distributed during Resource Distribution. See page 3 for details.)

Expectations

Riding a school bus is a privilege, not a right. The student who persists in misbehaving on the school bus jeopardizes the safety of everyone on the bus and may lose the privilege of riding the bus.

The bus driver is responsible for maintaining discipline on the bus and in this capacity has the authority to assign seats and to make other reasonable demands of students. Bus drivers may deliver a misbehaving student to a school principal or to the police before finishing the route in extreme circumstances. A principal will administer any necessary discipline. Once privileges are lost, that student cannot ride any bus for the duration of the suspension. Students will only be put off the bus at the bus stop or at school.

Bus Conduct

- Passengers must remain seated at all times while the bus is in motion.
- The bus driver may assign seats.
- Be courteous.
- ٠ No profanity.
- DO NOT eat or drink on the bus.
- Keep the bus clean. ٠
- No smoking.
- Keep all body parts and objects inside the bus.
- Do not throw anything inside or outside the bus.
- All instruments and equipment carried by passengers shall be under their control at all times and carried in their laps, between seats, or properly secured in a vacant seat. Nothing shall be placed in the driver's compartment or the stepwell.
- The aisle is to be open and passable at all times.
- No harmful objects and substances allowed on the bus at any time. This includes drugs, tobacco, alcohol, weapons, glass containers, pets, radios, skate boards, etc.
- Cleats and spikes are not allowed on the bus at any time.
- Do not destroy property. Students will be charged for damages.
- For your own safety, do not distract the bus driver through misbehavior.

Misbehavior on the bus can result in removal from the bus for I to 10 days, depending on circumstances, or permanent removal from the bus by formal hearing at discretion of the principal. Serious misbehavior on the bus may include suspension or expulsion from school.

If a student is not feeling well, they should report to the Nurse's office. If the student needs to be sent home, the Nurse will notify a parent/guardian. Students should not call and arrange to be picked up from school by their parent/ guardian without seeing the nurse.

Late to School?

When a student is dropped off late for school, a parent/guardian must sign the student in at the front office (please use visitor parking in the front lot - do not park along the curb).

If the student is late due to a doctor's appointment, s/he can show a doctor's note in lieu of a parent/guardian signature.

Students may NOT accept deliveries on campus. The front office, security and staff will NOT accept deliveries on behalf of students.



Visitor Information

Visitors to Mountain Pointe are welcome during regular business hours. All visitors must report to the main office immediately upon arrival on campus and show their photo ID to obtain a visitor badge.

Requiring photo ID is a safety measure that assists our office staff in knowing who is in the building should an emergency occur. This check of ID requires visitors to exit through the front office. Thank you for your cooperation.
