#### Mission Statement

The vision of Corona del Sol High School is to provide a safe, supportive, educational environment with comprehensive academic and extra curricular opportunities for each student to acquire the knowledge and develop skills necessary to become well rounded, contributing members of society.

#### School and Community

One of six public high schools in the Tempe Union High School District, Corona del Sol High School is located in south Tempe, Arizona. It opened its doors in 1977 and is accredited by AdvancED/NCA. Routinely earning a performance grade of "A" from the Arizona Department of Education, the school educates students in grades nine through twelve. Furthermore, Corona is recognized as an A+ School of Excellence by the Arizona Education Foundation. In 2009, the school earned the Blue Cross Blue Shield of Arizona Blue Cup Award, and, again in 2015, Corona won the 4A/5A Arizona Interscholastic Association 2015 Director's Cup for reaching the pinnacle of excellence in high school athletics, activities, scholastics, service, community, and character-based initiatives.

Corona has a current enrollment of approximately 2750 students: roughly 6% of whom are African American, 7% Asian, 50% Caucasian, 30% Hispanic, 3% Native American, and 5% of two or more races/ethnicities.

Statistically, 60% of graduates go on to attend a four-year university or college, while 24% attend a two-year community college, and 16% move on to vocational training, military service, or fulltime employment.

#### Graduation Requirements

Each academic year has two semesters. Credit is issued at the rate of 0.5 per class per semester. A minimum of 23.0 credits is required for graduation, as follows:

# Grading System

A = 90-100%; B = 80-89%; C = 70-79%; D = 60-69%; F = 0-59%. D is the lowest passing mark.

## 🌞 Grade Point Average

Corona utilizes a standard **unweighted 4.0 GPA scale** to determine student grade point averages, as follows: A=4; B=3; C=2; D=1; F=0. Only semester grades are used in computing GPA and class rank. This figure is reported on all student transcripts. A weighted GPA is also provided *for information purposes only*.

## 븆 Class Rank

The school uses a **weighted class rank** system, and the figure computed at the end of the seventh semester is considered the final class rank. Courses bearing weighted rank status, such as Advanced Placement, Honors, or otherwise accelerated classes, allow students to earn additional rank points, as follows: A=5, B=4, C=3; thus rewarding students for undertaking the advanced challenge and workload of these rigorous classes.
