### **Planners & District Handbooks**

During the <u>1st two weeks of school</u>, your student will receive TWO important items:

- 1) A student planner. These planners can be used for all classes at THS. It includes bell schedules, student resource information and general rules & procedures for the campus.
- 2) Student Policies & Regulations Handbook ELECTRONIC signature sheets. These forms will include rules/regulations, computer/internet access permission and media release information as well. ## **Highlighted School Rules**



#### **ELECTRONIC DEVICES: Cell Phones**

Cell phones must be turned off and put away during class time.

#### DRESS/APPEARANCE CODE

Tempe High requires that clothing and grooming demonstrated by students at school meet the standards of a high school environment. Student appearance shall not disrupt the education process or endanger student/staff health or safety. The THS student handbook has a detailed description of the dress code. ALL students and parents should read this carefully.

#### Some important parts of the dress code are:

- √ Shoes must be worn at all times.
- √ Students are prohibited from wearing or possessing on campus any attire or grooming disruptive to the education process. These may include (but are not limited to): memory shirts, bandanas (or bandana design), hairnets, scarves, do-rags, slippers, pajamas, etc,
- Immodest or revealing clothing is not allowed. Examples can include: spaghetti straps, seethrough clothing, halter tops, crop tops, off-the-shoulder tops, revealing clothing. Dresses/ skirts/shorts must be of modest length and style.
- √ Attire or accessories that advertise, display or promote any drug, alcohol, tobacco, sexual activity, violence, obscenities, disrespect or bigotry are not allowed.
- $\sqrt{\phantom{a}}$  Pants must fit appropriately with **no sagging** that exposes undergarments.

## Do we have your email address?

Please be sure we have your current and correct email address on file.

We need your email address on file for two reasons:

- Most communication for families/students will be done through email.
- √ Families will need to complete the re-enrollment process using their ParentVue Account.



## Reporting a Student's Absence

Parents/Guardians can call our ATTENDANCE Line 24 hours a day at (480) 967-1661; Press 1. To report an absence, the parent/guardian will need to include:

- √ Full name and ID number of student. Please spell the last name clearly.
- Date(s) and time(s) of absence and reason for absence(s)
- $\sqrt{}$  Relationship to the student and a current working phone number

Absences not excused within 24 hours will remain unexcused. NOTES are not accepted to excuse absences.

<u>Please note that district policy states, that the eleventh total absence may result in loss of credit for</u> the class, unless there are extenuating circumstances. All students must be enrolled in a minimum of four classes.

#### IMPORTANT NOTE ABOUT LATE ARRIVALS:

To excuse your student for arriving late to school, a parent/guardian MUST accompany the student into the front office. NO phone calls will be accepted to excuse a tardy.

## **Changes to Contact Information**

Parents & Legal Guardians, please inform the front office immediately IF:

- You have moved. A Change of Address form along with proof of residency is required (for example, a bill with the new address).
- There is change to your home, cell or work phone numbers.

There is change of your designated Emergency contact(s). It is important to have someone who can be contacted if we are unable to reach you during the school day.





## Buffalo Athletics

To be able to participate in athletics at THS, families must complete the AKTIVATE process (Formerly RMA)
Go to: www.aktivate.com. (Also available online at:

www.tempeunion.org/tempehigh under "Quick Links").

Create an account (or login to your current one) and complete the registration for the sport/activity you are interested in. You will need to scan and upload documents after registering with the system.



The THS Athletics Office is open beginning July 11th to help you!

ALL students participating in **Athletics, Cheer and Marching Band**, will need to be cleared.

You will need to **scan the following documents and upload them to AKTIVATE** 

- 1) Current Physical (required each year)
- 2) Birth Certificate
- 3) Brainbook Results and Opioid Ed Course (to complete visit www.aiaonline.org, required once)
- 4) Impact Test (taken with the THS Athletic Trainers each year)
- 5) Emergency Consent Form (also the office must have a copy of your insurance card on file, required each year) and Consent to Treat Form.

Athletes must have this entire process completed <u>BEFORE</u> they are cleared to tryout for a sport or activity.
