

## MARCOS FINE ARTS ACADEMY Visual and Interdisciplinary Arts Tracks

The VISUAL ARTS and INTERDISCIPLINARY ARTS tracks offer students a variety of courses, allowing them to focus on **Drawing** and **Painting**, **Ceramics**, **Photography**, or **Computer Graphics**, or a to choose a major and minor combining a variety of disciplines in visual and/or performing arts. Programs focus on building a strong foundation in visual design, college and/or career preparation, and portfolio development. Honors, Advanced Placement, CTE, and/or Dual-Enrollment options are available.

**VISUAL ARTS TRACK:** Completion of the Visual Arts Track requires a minimum of 5 credits in the Visual Arts. This must include 4 credits in studio courses and AP Art History. A minimum of 2 credits must be dual enrollment, AP, or honors level.

Entry into the Honors Track in any content area (Computer Graphics, Ceramics, Drawing and Painting, Photography) requires portfolio review by committee; please contact any of the Visual Arts Faculty for details.

**INTERDISCIPLINARY ARTS TRACK:** The Interdisciplinary Arts track was created to allow students to take a wider selection of visual and performing arts classes in order to provide a well-rounded arts education. Students can choose from any of the Visual Arts disciplines: AP Art History, Art & Design, Ceramics, Computer Graphics, Drawing & Painting, Photography; as well as the Performing Arts disciplines: Dance, Instrumental Music, Theatre, and Vocal Performance. Completion of the Interdisciplinary Track requires a minimum of 5 credits (with a sixth "suggested" art course):

- 3 credits in a Major (the 3 courses must be in one art discipline)
- 2 credits in a Minor (the 2 courses must be in one art discipline)
- 1 credit suggested in a third art course
