- 4. WPS is currently hosting two student teachers. Yulonda Elmore is working on an early childhood degree and a special education certification from Grand Canyon University. She will be mentored by Rakeya Brian and Jessica Humerez. Keanna Beason is working on an early childhood degree from USC Upstate and is being mentored by Kelsey Todd.
- 5. WPS will hold its first School Improvement Council meeting on October 3rd. The election of parent representatives is in progress.
- 6. At registration, WPS had over one hundred parents join PTO. We hope to continue to have parents join. Plans are in the works to increase opportunities for parent involvement and volunteer opportunities. We are looking forward to working with the PTO officers to make plans for the year.
- 7. Fifty-one WPS staff members are enrolled in Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling (LETRS). This is a two-year training where teachers are required to complete weekly reading,

online work, quizzes, and complete bridge to practice activities that tie their learning to their daily classroom practices. In addition to their weekly work, there are four full-day training sessions schedule each year with a Lexia LETRS trainer.

Instructional Reports

Mr. Russell Mahaffey reported the following:

- Teachers are evaluated under the Expanded ADEPT system. Teachers and principals access and sign evaluation forms in SC LEAD. This system requires a specified number of meetings to discuss progress toward Student Learning Objectives (SLOs) and feedback on classroom observations. Principals provided orientations for induction, annual, and continuing contract teachers at the beginning of the school year. They are currently meeting with staff to discuss and establish SLOs. These meetings must be completed by September 20.
- 2. Principals are evaluated under the PADEPP system. They are required to set goals related to student achievement and/or the needs assessment in the School Renewal Plans. In addition, principals are evaluated on the nine PADEPP standards every three years. They are evaluated on two of the nine PADEPP standards every year, which are Instructional Leadership and Principal's Professional Development. The deadline for their orientation and goal-setting conferences is September 15.
- 3. Thirty-eight teachers have professional licenses that will expire on June 30, 2025. Three of those teachers have already submitted the 120 credits required for certificate renewal.
- 4. The first Induction class will meet on September 10. The September session will address the following topics: overview of the induction program, Expanded ADEPT system, SC Teaching Standards 4.0 rubric, SC LEAD evaluation portal, data analysis, needs assessment, and Student Learning Objectives (SLOs).
- 5. Interim reports will be issued on Wednesday, September 18.

Mrs. Rachel Traynham reported the following:

- 1. SPED:
 - a. We continue to work in the State EdPlan System
 - b. County-wide SPED meeting was held September 5th in Spartanburg School District 5
 - c. We will hold SPED Teacher meetings at the District Office this week:
 - i. WPS/WES -September 10 @ 3:00
 - ii. WMS/WHS-September 11 @ 3:30
- 2. Nursing:
 - a. Nurse McCarley has sent out the school exclusion list from SC Department of Public Health (previously DHEC)
 - b. This year the Employee Health Fair will be held October 25, 2024, in the High School Cafeteria.
- 3. Mental Health:
 - a. We are currently serving around 100 students among our D4 staff. We have already completed several Columbia Screeners and called EMS for student transport related to Mental Health.
- 4. Multi-Lingual Learners:
 - a. Teachers are actively screening students daily. We have 177 students currently served under this program.
- 5. Federal and State Programs:
 - a. We are currently working on final expenditures for our ESSER III Funding. Title 1, Title II, Title IV, CTE, and Special Education grants have been submitted for this school year. Funds may be spent upon approval.
 - b. There will be a meeting in Columbia for Federal and State Programs on September 20th that I plan to attend.
