The School and The Community

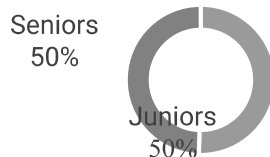

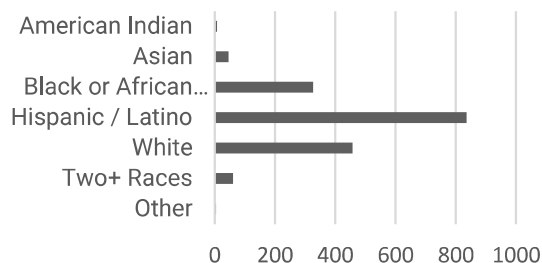
Student Demographics and Enrollment

Princeton High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling 1250 students in grades 11-12. This includes our first generation students totaling 15% and those that qualify for Free / Reduced Lunch equaling 56%.

Curriculum

Our school operates on a two-semester program. Student schedules consist of seven periods per day. For most students, 3.5 credits is the maximum course load earned in a semester. Graduation requirements consist of 26 credits and the completion of a Graduation Endorsement. Students have their choice of 23 graduation endorsements from which to select. Grades are recorded on the transcript and GPA / Class Rank are computed in January and May. Final GPA and Rank for seniors is completed in April.
