What is Title I?

Sandy Springs MS is identified as a Title I school as part of Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement plan.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Sandy Springs MS will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Sandy Springs MS values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Sandy Springs MS will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.



How is it revised?

Sandy Springs MS invited all parents to attend our annual School Forum last spring to review and revise this parent and family engagement plan, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-family compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school's website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and by mail to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year including our annual Community Cares event.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Sandy Springs MS will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student handbook that is given to all students. As a reminder, we will email the plan to all parents in August before the scheduled Open House event. The plan will also be posted on the school's website and social media. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

2024-2025 District Goals

Increase the percentage of all students scoring Proficient or Distinguished on Reading Milestones.

Increase the percentage of all students scoring Proficient or Distinguished on Math Milestones.

2024-2025 School Goals

Math: By May 2025, 71% of students will score at the Developing, Proficient, or Distinguished Level on the Georgia Milestones Math assessment, an increase of 3%.

ELA: By May 2025, 76.1% of students will score at the Developing, Proficient, or Distinguished Level on the Georgia Milestones ELA assessment, an increase of 3%.

Focus Areas:

Math: Developing an understanding of numbers and operations in all mathematical areas.

Reading: Reading fluency and comprehension.
Vocabulary development.

School-Family Compacts

As part of this plan, Sandy Springs MS and our families will develop a school-family compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers during the Community Cares event and

the School Forum. The school-parent compacts also are shared with parents during parent-teacher conferences and kept with each child's teacher if parents need another copy.

STEM/ Math Night – January 22, 2025

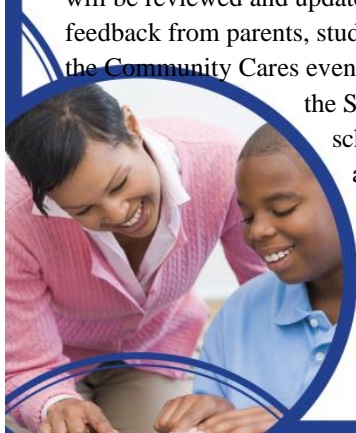
Enjoy a night of STEM activities, games, and information fun for the whole family!

- That parents are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision-making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child.

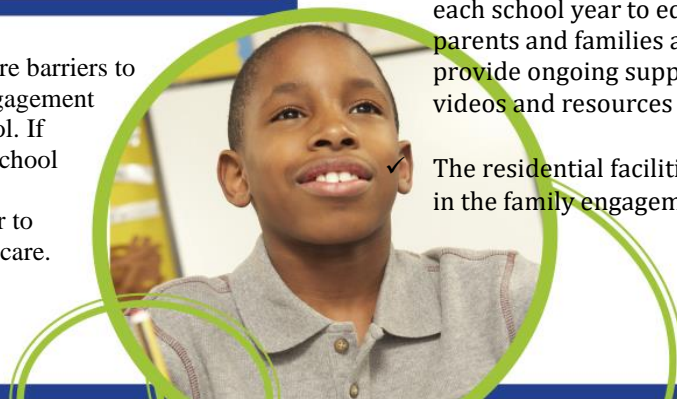

Sandy Springs MS is Branching Out!

SSCMS will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

- ✓ Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish.
- ✓ Providing parents with a description and explanation of the curriculum in use at the school the forms of academic assessments used to measure student progress, and the achievement levels of the challenging State academic standards.
- ✓ Providing training and workshops to support families on topics such as: technology training (e.g., how-to use Infinite Campus), and academic workshops aligned to student achievement including, but not limited to, SSCMS areas of emphasis: STEM and literacy.
- ✓ Providing materials to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement such as ELA/Reading and Math resources available for check out in the Parent Resource Center.
- ✓ Providing families with timely information about Title I programs in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand.
- ✓ Providing flexible time and number of meetings, such as meetings in the morning and evening. Meetings will be offered in different formats such as virtual or in person.
- ✓ The school will hold an initial in-service in the fall and an additional meeting in the spring each school year to educate all teachers and staff on how to improve communication with parents and families and how to work with parents as equal partners. The school will provide ongoing support to staff through other sources, such as: webinars, instructional videos and resources provided online to build staff capacity throughout the school year.
- ✓ The residential facilities for students in the Sandy Springs MS's attendance area is included in the family engagement correspondence and activities.
