FinalForms

Parent Access

Stay up to date with your child's academic progress by creating a Parent Access Account. With a PA account, parents can view their child's grades online and in real-time. Items such as grades, attendance and teacher comments are available for viewing by parents as soon as they are posted in a teacher's online gradebook. If you have previously created a Parent Access Account, your account will remain active until your child graduates. The only thing you need to update at the beginning of the year is your alert setups. If you have not vet created an account, letters containing the information needed to set up an account were sent home a couple of weeks ago. In **6th grade ELA**, we have started Module 0 of our curriculum. Students have been busy learning the instructional routines we will use throughout the year as well as challenging themselves to get creative with poetry. This week, students completed a gallery walk in which they shared and critiqued each others' poems - it was a hit! At the end of Module 0, students will create a poetry portfolio that will be on display along with other writing pieces later in the year. So far the 6th grade students have been SHINING in ELA with positive attitudes and great work ethics. We are so excited to see where this year takes us!



The **7th graders in World Studies** have been studying primary and secondary sources. They have been learning to identify and analyze these sources in preparation for the beginning of their PBL project, "Lost Voices"! This year's 7th graders will focus on the rich Shawnee heritage of our area and produce podcasts about topics such as Tecumseh, the attack of Moluntha and his people at Mackachack, and the removal of the Shawnee in 1837. This year, students will enjoy a field trip to Great Council State Park as a culminating activity for their PBL and as a way to experience history.



8th grade American History students have gotten right into work this semester. We are going deep into a unit all about government covering concepts such as different types of government in different countries, Enlightenment thinkers who inspired our government, separating powers into 3 branches, checks and balances, our rights covered in the Bill of Rights, and how citizens can get involved. Some fun activities we've been able to do while learning include creating governments out of gummy bears and reviewing Michaelangelo style.



6th Grade Social Studies:

My classes are in the middle of a unit reviewing Geography. They are using Google Earth, their Chromebooks, and a desk map to plot latitude and longitude with their partners. Collaboratively they are identifying the continents, oceans, special lines of latitude and longitude, and countries from all over the world!



7th grade ELA Ms. Davis, Mr. Tobias, Mrs. Nehls

We are currently studying "Identity in the Middle Ages". We have been reading a variety of texts to build background knowledge of this time period. While reading, we are also practicing skills to improve writing and build stamina. We also completed an activity where students read about different social classes of medieval society then presented the information to the class. We have also been working on Habits of Discussions and Habits of Attention to help students build strong ELA skills. Students have been having great conversations and are developing an appreciation for learning from each other.

8th Grade ELA

Eighth graders began the year by reviewing key story elements, including plot, theme, characterization, and setting. We then analyzed how these elements develop throughout various short stories.

Currently, we are reading *The Crossover* by Kwame Alexander as part of our exploration to answer the essential question: "What is the power of storytelling?" We are looking forward to a fun and successful school year!
