CSDA Happenings

Grade 4: In science, students have started to learn about animal classifications and will be starting an Animal Research Project. In math class, students will be starting to learn about adding and subtracting multi-digit whole numbers. On September 16th, students will be doing a variety of activities to explore Constitution Day. Students also continue to learn about personal narratives in reading and writing.

Grade 5: Fifth graders have been working on place value in math. In reading, students have been learning about personal narratives along with strong verbs and adjectives.

Grade 6: Sixth graders have been working on reviewing operations with fractions and have enjoyed beginning our new Amplify ELA curriculum. Time to get this school year rolling!

CSDA Unified Arts: In our library, students have been learning about classroom expectations and routines. Students also began learning about our read-aloud for each grade level and the historical context for each book.

RMMS Happenings

PreK: Students had a fantastic first week of preschool! They will continue their All About Me unit next week and introduce their sensory table routines.

Grade K: Next week, kindergarteners will begin Writer's Workshop. They will work on drawing pictures with added details.

Grade 1: Next week, first graders will continue to review letter sounds and letter formation. Students will compare numbers during math.

Grade 2: Second graders will be celebrating Dot Day on Monday! The day is inspired by the book, The Dot, by Peter Reynolds and is a celebration of creativity, courage, and connection.

Grade 3: Next week, third graders will learn and explore Constitution Day by doing a variety of activities. Students will continue to build their reading life during Reader's Workshop.

RMMS Unified Arts: In the learning commons, students are getting reacquainted with the library. Grade K and 1 are learning how to navigate the different areas of the library by choosing a "just right" book and how to check out. Grades 2 and 3 are reviewing book browsing, library etiquette, learning fiction call numbers, and putting them in alphabetical order.

SEASONAL ALLERGY MANAGEMENT



Fall allergies to ragweed and other weeds are in full swing.

- Symptoms can include itchy/watery eyes, runny or stuffy nose, nasal congestion or sinus pressure, sneezing and/or scratchy throat.
- If your child is experiencing these symptoms, please contact your child's doctor for an assessment and management plan.
- The health office does not have eye, nasal or oral allergy medications.

Free & Reduced VERY IMPORTANT!!!

EACH school year a <u>new</u> application MUST be submitted (1 per household family) even if your child was receiving free or reduced meals the last school year.

PLEASE – if you have qualified in the past or think you might qualify, fill out an application NOW.

Meals

Breakfast and lunch are available each day at all schools.

Style of serving meals will vary by school – please call the head cook at your child's school if you have specific questions.

HBHS and HBMS have many lunch choices each day including a main entrée, salads, sandwiches, and yogurt.

Elementary schools have a main lunch choice, yogurt lunch choice and a sandwich or salad lunch choice.

Snacks & Purchasing Info

We offer snacks, drinks and a la carte items at HBHS & HBMS. A selection of Smart Snack Compliant snacks are available at CSDA & HUES. Students MUST have money in their accounts or cash to buy snacks, bottled drinks, and second servings.

MILK: One milk per meal is served with all meals. Extra milk or single-purchase milk is \$0.50, regardless of free/reduced meal eligibility and will be charged to the account (and students must have money in their accounts).

Lunch account balances rollover year to year (negative and positive). Please visit myschoolbucks.com if you are unsure of your student's balance.

How do I add money to an account?

We recommend sending in a check or using myschoolbucks.com to make a payment online. If you must send cash, please put it in an envelope with your student's name and it will be deposited into your student's account. Checks are made payable to:



Saturday September 21st, 2024 10:00 am - 2:00 pm Rain or Shine


Brookline Public Works Facility - 42 North Mason Rd


